The Basics

Technical skills and requirements vary greatly from one occupation to another. But success in just about any field depends on some fundamental abilities. Generally, these are

- Communication Skills: listening, speaking, reading, writing, interpreting, negotiating, persuading
- Organizational Skills: planning, managing time, using resources efficiently, understanding systems, monitoring and evaluating data to improve performance
- Thinking Skills: problem-solving, decision-making, creative thinking, learning, analyzing, mathematics
- Working Skills: self-management, team concept, responsibility flexibility, leadership, acceptance of diversity
- TechnologySkills: computer literacy, ability to select and apply appropriate equipment and procedures, ability to interpret and use data generated by technological devices

These are the general skills that you'll need to bring to the job market. Just as important is the way you approach that market and show employers who you are and what you can do. Here's a basic set of skills for doing that effectively:

- 1. Recognizing and making career decisions
- 2. Using available information (like this brochure) about the labor market
- 3. Preparing an effective résumé
- 4. Filling out applications
- 5.Interviewing
- 6.Being consistently punctual
- 7. Maintaining regular attendance
- 8. Showing a positive attitude
- 9. Presenting appropriate appearance
- 10. Showing good interpersonal relations
- 11. Completing tasks thoroughly and efficiently

Finding Your Work

Finding work is not so hard. But it's something else to find "your work" -that is, a career that you enjoy, that you're good at, that pays well enough, and that takes your life in a positive direction. Doing that takes some thought, planning, effort, and-just as important-imagination.

Take advantage of change

In the past, when most people planned a career, they just did it once. Then they stayed in the same job, or at least the same field, for a lifetime. Career advice used to be something like the sign on a rough and weather-worn dirt road: "Choose your rut carefully-you're going to be in it a long time." It doesn't often work that way anymore, and that's not all bad.

Knowing that your career direction will probably change many times can seem insecure, but it can also be exciting to realize that you don't have to get everything exactly right the first time. You can build your skills gradually and combine them in your own way as your goals and your understanding of available opportunities become clearer.

Understanding-and even anticipating-change is an important career-building skill. Like most of the others, it has a lot to do with attitude. The more of these skills you learn, the more control you'll have over the direction your life will take.
