FY 2009-10 Higher Education General Fund Reduction - BA-1

Proposal:

The Department has four state-funded sections in the Long Bill: allocations to the College Opportunity Fund Program (COF stipends and fee for service contracts), the state's financial aid programs, the appropriation to the local district colleges, and the appropriation to the area vocational schools. The Department proposes a \$100,000,000 General Fund reduction to the budget submission for FY 2009-10 (submitted on November 1, 2008 and subsequently amended on November 10, 2008). The Department's FY 2008-09 reduction request dated January 15, 2009, was based on proportionate cuts to the governing board, local district colleges, and the area vocational schools based on how much new General Fund they received in FY 2008-09 over the prior year. The Department proposed to keep a portion of the reduction allocation methodology consistent for the proposed FY 2009-10 cuts (in "Part A" below).

Summary of Request:

In order to cut \$100,000,000 General Fund in FY 2009-10, the Department recommends a three part cut:

- Part A: Implementing cuts of \$52,530,781 General Fund by proportionately applying the cut to institutions based on the allocation model utilized for the FY 2008-09 proposed cut (this is based on the General Fund growth in funding from FY 2007-08 to FY 2008-09);
- Part B: Withdrawing the November 10, 2008 FY 2009-10 request (while leaving in the statutorily required components) for a \$38,466,392 General Fund reduction; and
- Part C: Implementing proposed cuts to specific programs or line items resulting in a \$9,002,827 General Fund reduction in FY 2009-10.

Part A

The Department proposes cutting \$52,530,781 General Fund in FY 2009-10 from the governing boards and institutions of Higher Education based on allocations in FY 2008-09. As such, the institutions' percentage of growth in General Fund (or College Opportunity Fund) from FY 2007-08 to FY 2008-09 is utilized to cut this share of the proposal. The table below identifies the percentage of the allocation from FY 2008-09 which results in the FY 2009-10 cut for Part A. The cut to the Governing Boards will be administered through the College Opportunity Fund fee-for-service contracts.

Part B

The Department proposes withdrawing the General Fund increase submitted in the November 10, 2008 FY 2009-10 budget requests. This includes reductions that are identified in the "Part B" table (on the following page). Included in this reduction is the removal of the inflationary increase in the College Opportunity Fund - stipends. However, portions of the November 10, 2008 request remain intact, including the following:

• \$120,060 General Fund for the College Opportunity Fund – Stipend for private institutions (due to increased population from the Colorado Christian University ruling);

Methodology:

- 1) Original increase of \$159,975 included \$123,975 for new Colorado Christian University students and \$36,000 stipend inflation adjustment for students at existing participating private institutions
- 2) \$123,975 / \$1,425 per FTE = 87 FTE;
- 3) 87 FTE * \$1,380 per FTE = \$120,060 for FY 2009-10.
- \$150,000 General Fund for increase funding for the Colorado National Guard Tuition Assistance Program. As identified in the November 10, 2008 "DI-3" statutory change is required to:

The Department recommends the elimination of the state's merit financial aid program (\$1,500,000 General Fund) and the Precollegiate Academic Competitiveness Grant (\$1,600,000 General Fund) in FY 2009-10. The merit program was cut significantly from about \$16,000,000 to \$1,500,000 during the last recession, while the Academic Competitiveness Grant was created to match Federal scholarships (note: the state match is not required in order to receive the Federal scholarship).

The Department recommends eliminating the state's need based financial aid allocation to graduate students. This recommendation results in a \$5,902,827 General Fund reduction in FY 2009-10 – based on the continuation of the amount allocated in FY 2008-09. This will be achieved through both budgetary action and a policy change through the Colorado Commission on Higher Education. Institutions of higher education award need-based grants to graduate students out of their share of the state's need based program (Long Bill Line Item (3) (A)). The Department recommends this reduction be made in the FY 2009-10 budget process and administered in the allocations to each governing board approved by the Colorado Commission on Higher Education.

Other Issues:

The Department of Higher Education's proposed reductions may be revised as further exploration is done to achieve General Fund savings in FY 2009-10.

Additionally, the Department of Higher Education is pursuing action from the Federal government which would supplant the General Fund that is statutorily required for covering the cost of tuition for Native American students at Fort Lewis College. This amount has not been identified as a cut amount since current law requires that the State provide General Fund for this purpose. The Department will continue to pursue this action and, if successful, doing so would provide an additional cut in FY 2009-10.

Budget Reduction Proposal January 23, 2009

Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad Commission Reduction - CTSRR-BA-1

Proposal:

The Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad Commission is proposing a \$25,000 General Fund reduction from its FY 2009-10 request on November 1, 2008. The railroad would accomplish this by reducing the legal and project planning line items and reducing one internal staff position. The C&TSRR Commission has received an appropriation of \$100,000 General Fund in the last two fiscal years and has a total request of \$250,000 General Fund in FY 2009-10 (when including its decision item).

Summary of Request:

The Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad proposes the following to reduce its FY 2009-10 request by \$25,000 General Fund:

- Reduce legal by \$1,000. Commission has no legal issues pending or anticipated, so we anticipate savings in this item.
- Reduce project planning by \$1,500. Due to reduced capital funding prospects, there will be reduced need to plan projects.
- Reduce one staff position. Due to reduced funding need to reduce staff cost.
- Reduce annual routine maintenance by \$15,000. Amount available for annual routine maintenance program will be reduced.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

- No statutory change is needed.
- Section 24-60-1903, C.R.S. (2008): **Appointment of member of compact commission.** After said compact becomes effective, the two Colorado members of the four-member Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad commission shall be appointed by the governor and shall serve until revocation of their appointment by the governor, and, on behalf of the Cumbres Toltec scenic railroad commission, the state of Colorado shall pay the necessary expenses and also compensation of said members in an amount which shall be fixed by the governor and when so fixed shall be changed only by action of the governor.
