1 - Refinance General Fund in the Division of Local Government and Field Services

Proposal:

The Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) analyzed the relationship between the Field Services program, the State Demography Office and the Local Government Energy and Mineral Impact Program and recommends that both the Field Services Program and the State Demography Office costs be allocated to local government impact funds. Changing the source for financing these services provided to impacted areas would result in a reduction of \$943,127 General Fund and an increase of \$1,124,289 in reappropriated funds in FY 2009-10 and FY 2010-11.

Summary of Request:

- The Field Services unit within Division of Local Government at DOLA provides general and technical assistance to local governments in areas "impacted by the development, processing, or energy conversion of fuels and minerals". In fact, recent reports submitted by severance and Federal Mineral Lease taxpayers indicate that people working in the energy and mineral development industry live in every county in the state. Currently, the Field Services unit does not provide any assistance on General Funded programs. However, 4.9 FTE within the unit are still General Funded. The Department believes that because no General Fund programs are served by the Field Services unit, the funding for FTE in this unit should be adjusted. This proposal would instead fund these FTE from Mineral and Energy Impact program funds, the largest program within the Division of Local Government.
- The State Demography Office is located within the Division of Local Government and currently employs 6.0 FTE. The Office has a close association with the Energy and Mineral Impact program because staff forecasts population growth, energy industry employment trends, housing data, and resultant demand for public facilities and services. This data is used by the Energy and Mineral Impact program to accurately allocate Federal Mineral Lease and Severance Tax revenues to localities through both direct distribution and grants. This proposal would refinance two of the 6.0 FTE in the State Demography Office. These FTE are both lower level classifications, reflecting the assumption the mostly line staff in the office would process the data used by the Mineral and Energy Impact program.
- Local government needs and program revenues from both state severance taxes and federal mineral
 lease funds have increased dramatically in recent years. Specifically, the amount of grant awards and
 direct distribution to local governments has more than quadrupled from Fiscal Year 2003 (\$27.8
 million) to Fiscal Year 2008 (\$111.4 million). This expanded need is requiring additional staff time that
 could be charged legitimately to the appropriate Local Government Mineral and Energy cash funds in
 lieu of General Fund.
- During state fiscal years 1997 through 2002, the average number of Impact grants per year was 162. For fiscal years 2003 through 2008, the average number of grants per year increased to 359. With nearly a 200% increase in workload and forecast data needs, Mineral and Energy Impact Grant assistance now

represents the majority of workload for the Field Services unit. Therefore, a reallocation of how program costs are funded was deemed necessary and appropriate.

- The current cost to administer the Impact program represents 2.2% of the Severance and FML revenues that DOLA manages. This proposal will minimally increase the cost to administer the program by 0.5% for a new total of 2.7%.
- The proposed refinancing will allow the Department to capture additional indirect costs from the
 Division of Local Government. Based on the FY 2009-10 indirect cost recovery plan for the
 Department of Local Affairs, this amount will be \$181,162. The Department plans to use the full
 amount of additional recovery to defray General Fund expenditures in the Executive Directors Office
 for Capitol Complex Leased Space.

The fund was established to provide funding to localities for the cleanup of illegally disposed waste tires and incentives to local governments and private sector to encourage the re-use and recycling of waste tires.

Impact of Recommended Reduction:

- This proposal would transfer the funds available to the Department of Local Affairs (approximately \$2,700,000) from the Waste Tire program in FY 2009-10 to the General Fund. As a result, grants in FY 2009-10 would not be awarded or distributed. This proposal will eliminate new grant funding in FY 2009-10 for new DOLA grants. It will not affect grants already under contract or encumbered. The Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) should receive approximately \$2,733,333 from the fund in FY 2009-10.
- The proposed transfer will not impact those funds scheduled to be disbursed to the Department of Public Health and Environment or the Colorado Commission of Higher Education. In FY 2009-10, it is estimated the Department of Public Health and Environment will receive approximately \$520,000 and the Colorado Commission of Higher Education approximately \$346,667.

• In addition, both the Departments of Revenue and the Department of Public Health and Environment receive funding to cover the indirect costs of administering its grant program. These allocations are also not affected by the transfer proposal.

Assumptions:

The proposed transfer is based on the following assumptions:

- No new grant funding will be administered through DOLA for FY 2009-10. Transfers will be made
 to the Departments of Public Health and Environment or Higher Education for FY 2009-10 per
 current statute. The balance left over after the proposed transfer will cover statutory obligations for
 the other two programs.
- The portion of funds provided to the Departments of Revenue, Local Affairs, and Public Health and Environment for indirect administrative costs is assumed to occur in full prior to any further distributions from the fund.
- Revenue estimates are prepared by the Department of Local Affairs and are based on prior year actual data.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

25-17-202 (1) (a) and (b), C.R.S. (2008) – Waste tire recycling development fee – cash fund created. The statute specifies that the Department of Revenue will collect the surcharges for waste tire disposal and transmit such to the State Treasurer for credit to the fund. This amount is then subject to annual appropriation by the General Assembly.

25-17-202 (3) (a) (I) and (II), C.R.S. (2008) – Directs the General Assembly to make annual appropriations to the Department of Revenue in an amount equal to its' direct and indirect administrative costs, and to the Department of Public Health and Environment for direct and indirect costs but not to exceed \$15,000 in FY 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12.

- To effectuate this cash fund transfer both an executive order and legislation are needed. The executive order is necessary to restrict disbursements by the Department of Treasury to the Department of Local Affairs from the Waste Tire Recycling Fund.
- OSPB intends to clarify spending authority with supplemental revision to the affected line items. These are not included in this packet and will be submitted on September 14, 2009.

Purpose of Fund:

To provide a "rainy day" fund accessible by legislative appropriation in the event that federal mineral leasing funds anticipated to be available in any current fiscal year are forecasted to be more than ten percent less than the preceding fiscal year.

¹ It is possible the fund could receive bonus payments this year, however bonus payments are not estimated for the purposes of this analysis. Currently, these are not forecasted because the Department does not receive information from the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) regarding which lands will be sold until after the fact.

Impact of Recommended Reduction:

The fund receives 50% of all federal mineral lease bonus payments made to the State. The fund was created in S.B.08-208 and consists almost entirely of Roan Plateau lease bonus payments. In the 2009 legislative session, S.B.09-232 transferred \$17 million from the fund to be made available to mineral impacted communities for multi-jurisdictional grant projects. Although the fund will continue to receive 50% of all federal mineral lease bonus payments, this proposed transfer will significantly impact the amount available for future appropriation by the General Assembly.

Assumptions:

• Revenue is not projected because it is near impossible to predict ahead of time what lands the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will sell and at what price.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

Section C.R.S. 34-63-102 (5.3) (a) (I) (A) and (B) (2008) - Fifty percent of federal mineral lease bonus payments shall be transferred to the local government permanent fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury. Interest and income derived from the deposit and investment of moneys in the local government permanent fund shall be credited to the permanent fund and shall not be transferred to the general fund or any other fund at the end of any fiscal year. Except as otherwise provided in sub-subparagraph (B) of this subparagraph (I), moneys in the permanent fund shall not be expended for any purpose.

If, based on the revenue estimate prepared by the staff of the legislative council in March of any fiscal year, it is anticipated that the total amount of moneys that will be deposited into the mineral leasing fund pursuant to subparagraph (II) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of this section during the fiscal year will be at least ten percent less than the amount of moneys so deposited during the immediately preceding fiscal year, the general assembly may appropriate moneys from the local government permanent fund to the department of local affairs for the current fiscal year.

Since the General Assembly must appropriate these funds, no restriction on the fund is necessary. However, this proposal will require statutory change to allow the suggested amount to be transferred to the General Fund.

Local Government Limited Gaming Impact Fund

Purpose of Fund:

To provide financial assistance to designated local governments for documented gaming impacts. This assistance is provided in the form of grants under the authority of the executive director of the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA). Eligible recipients are Teller and Gilpin Counties and an eight county area contiguous to these counties (Boulder, Clear Creek, Grand, Jefferson, El Paso, Fremont, Park, and Douglas). Archuleta, La Plata and Montezuma Counties are also eligible because they are contiguous to tribal lands where gaming activities are being conducted. Municipalities within the eligible counties, except for the gaming cities themselves, and special districts providing emergency services within the eligible counties, may also apply for these funds.

The Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) receives 98% of the revenue credited to the fund. These funds are distributed as grants on a competitive, but discretionary basis at the authority of the Executive Director of the DOLA. The remaining 2% of revenue credited to the fund is appropriated to the Department of Human Services to provide gambling addiction services to Colorado residents.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

12-47.1-1601, C.R.S. (2008) - Local government limited gaming impact fund - Establishes the fund and designates the local government limited gaming impact account to be managed by the Department of Local Affairs and the gambling addiction account to be managed by the Department of Human Services. Of the 50% share to be transferred to the General Fund from gaming revenue, this fund shall receive 13%. This amount is allocated at 98% to the Department of Local Affairs and 2% to the Department of Human Services.

This proposal will require statutory change to allow the suggested amount to be transferred to the General Fund. OSPB intends to clarify spending authority with supplemental revision to the line item. This is not included in this packet and will be submitted on September 14, 2009.

Impact of Recommended Reduction:

This transfer would leave slightly less funding available for grants to local communities in mineral impacted areas of the State. It does not impact the amount scheduled for direct distribution that will be dispersed to eligible counties on August 31, 2009 as directed by law. The suggested transfer also leaves available approximately \$46 million for grants in FY 2009-10.

²This amount represents the restoration of one-day transfers made by the State Controller pursuant to S.B.09-279.

³This amount includes \$46 million estimated to be made available for grants in FY 2009-10.

⁴These amounts include the statutorily mandated set-aside for Uranium Mill Trailing Remediation Action Program fund as well as estimates for the amounts needed to cover encumbered contracts that have not yet been paid in full.

Per the Governor's direction, \$25 million of the amount estimated available for grants will be withheld from distribution until January 31, 2010 pending further action by the General Assembly. If the General Assembly does not take action to use the funds elsewhere, these will be released and available for grants.

Assumptions:

The proposed transfer is based on the following assumptions:

- Revenue projections per Legislative Councils June 2009 economic forecast.
- A full restoration of the one-day transfer made by the State Controller based upon SB09-279.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

39-29-110 (1) (a), C.R.S. (2008) – Local government severance tax fund – creation – <u>administration</u> – definitions. There is hereby created in the department of local affairs a local government severance tax fund. In accordance with section 39-29-108, portions of the state severance tax receipts shall be credited to the local government severance tax fund. Except as otherwise provided in section 39-29-109.5, all income derived from the deposit and investment of the moneys in the local government severance tax fund shall be credited to the local government severance tax fund. After making direct distribution disbursements, the executive director of the department of local affairs shall distribute any remaining moneys and make loans from such fund in accordance with the purposes and priorities provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection (1).

39-29-110 (1) (b) (I) and (II), C.R.S. (2008) - Seventy percent of the funds from the local government severance tax fund shall be distributed to those political subdivisions socially or economically impacted by the development, processing, or energy conversion of minerals and mineral fuels subject to taxation under this article and used for the planning, construction, and maintenance of public facilities and for the provision of public services. The executive director of the department of local affairs shall consider the economic needs of a political subdivision for purposes of making distributions pursuant to this subparagraph (I). The executive director may distribute moneys or make loans, or any combination thereof, to such political subdivisions for the planning, design, construction, erection, building, acquisition, alteration, modernization, reconstruction, improvement, or expansion of domestic wastewater treatment works or potable water treatment facilities.

39-29-110 (1) (c) (I), C.R.S. (2008) Establishes the 30% direct distributions to impacted communities.

C.R.S. 39-29-110 (1) (A) (2008) – Allocates moneys to the uranium mill tailings remedial action program fund in accordance with the provisions of section 39-29-116 (3).

Pursuant to the statutes identified above, the executive director of the Department of Local Affairs has authority to administer these severance tax funds. Therefore, no executive order is necessary to halt disbursements of said funds in FY 2009-10. This proposal will require statutory change to allow the suggested amount to be transferred to the General Fund.
