Budget Reduction Proposal August 24, 2009

Reduce Tony Grampsas Youth Services Grants

Proposal:

The Department of Public Health and Environment proposes to eliminate the \$1.0 million in General Fund for the Tony Grampsas Youth Services Program (TGYS) in FY 2009-10. TGYS will have \$3,992,530 in cash spending authority remaining from the Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement (MSA) funding. This proposal also reduces \$1.0 million General Fund in FY 2010-11.

Summary of Request:

- Recipients of TGYS grants are organizations that provide services to youth with a variety of different approaches and programs including early childhood education, violence prevention, mentoring, student dropout prevention and restorative justice programs.
- Evaluations of recipient programs have found that the programs spend the grant funds as intended, and
 on programs that appear to be valued in the different settings and communities where implemented.
 However, the Department does not have evidence that the program has produced an associated
 statewide decrease in the targeted negative outcomes such as school drop-out or recidivism or an
 increase in positive targets such as school readiness.
- There is no evidence to support that eliminating the General Fund will have a direct negative impact on the intended targeted outcomes.
- The following is a summary of the funding history of the TGYS Program:
 - o FY 2002-2003 Governor Owens vetoed the program's only funding source, \$7.6 million in General Fund, in order to cover budget losses after the 2002 recession.
 - o FY 2003-2004 There was no state funding allocated for the TGYS Program.
 - o FY 2004-2005 A one-time award of \$4 million in federal job growth dollars in addition to \$2.3 million in Master Settlement Agreement funding was appropriated but no General Fund was restored at that time.
 - o FY 2005-2006 \$3.5 million in Master Settlement Agreement funding was appropriated but no General Fund was allocated to the program this year.
 - o FY 2006-2007 A one-time award of \$4.0 million in General Fund in addition to \$3.2 million in MSA funding was allocated to the program this year.
 - FY 2007-2008 \$3.3 million in Master Settlement Agreement funding was allocated to the program this year.
 - FY 2008-2009 The General Assembly allocated \$1 million in General Fund along with \$4.1 million in Master Settlement Agreement funding to the program.
- To achieve the \$1 million reduction, the TGYS Board likely will implement the following strategies: eliminate training and technical assistance for grantees, limit program evaluation and reduce grants. Grant reductions likely will be achieved through an overall reduction to all grantees (93 contracts) of 18% or by eliminating grants to organizations that received the lowest scores on their original grant applications.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

There is no statutory change required to eliminate the state support for this program. The appropriation for this program will be restricted under the existing authority of the Executive Director. However, the appropriation will require revision to reflect the reduction as noted in this requested budget action.

- 25-20.5-200 et seq. C.R.S. (2009) Tony Grampsas youth services program creation standards applications.
- (1) (a) The youth crime prevention and intervention program created in part 28 of article 32 of title 24, C.R.S., as it existed prior to August 1, 2000, is hereby transferred to the division and is renamed the Tony Grampsas youth services program. All program grants in existence as of July 1, 2000, shall continue to be valid through July 31, 2001. Persons appointed to the youth crime prevention and intervention program board, hereby renamed the Tony Grampsas youth services board, shall continue serving until completion of their terms and may be reappointed as provided in section 25-20.5-202.
- (b) The Tony Grampsas youth services program is established to provide state funding for community-based programs that target youth and their families for intervention services in an effort to reduce incidents of youth crime and violence. In addition, the Tony Grampsas youth services program shall promote prevention and education programs that are designed to reduce the occurrence and reoccurrence of child abuse and neglect and to reduce the need for state intervention in child abuse and neglect prevention and education.
- (2) (a) The Tony Grampsas youth services program shall be administered through the division. Subject to the designation in paragraph (b) of this subsection (2), the Tony Grampsas youth services board created in section <u>25-20.5-202</u> shall choose those entities that will receive grants through the Tony Grampsas youth services program and the amount of each grant. In addition, the division shall monitor the effectiveness of programs that receive funds through the Tony Grampsas youth services program.
- (b) Any grant awarded through the Tony Grampsas youth services program shall be paid from moneys appropriated pursuant to paragraph (c) of this subsection (2) or out of the general fund for such program. Each year, no less than twenty percent of the appropriation shall be designated and used exclusively for programs designed for children younger than nine years of age. The board, in accordance with the timelines adopted pursuant to section 25-20.5-202 (3), shall submit a list of the entities chosen to receive grants to the governor for approval. The governor shall either approve or disapprove the entire list of entities by responding to the board within twenty days. If the governor has not responded to the board

within twenty days after receipt of the list, the list shall be deemed approved. No grants shall be awarded through the Tony Grampsas youth services program without the prior approval of the governor.(c) Pursuant to section 24-75-1104.5 (1) (I), C.R.S., beginning in the 2004-05 fiscal year, and for each fiscal year thereafter so long as the state receives moneys pursuant to the master settlement agreement, the general assembly shall appropriate to the division for the Tony Grampsas youth services program four percent of the amount of moneys transmitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the master settlement agreement, other than attorney fees and costs, for the preceding fiscal year; except that the amount so appropriated to the division in any fiscal year shall not exceed five million dollars. The general assembly shall appropriate the amount specified in this paragraph (c) from moneys credited to the tobacco litigation settlement cash fund created in section 24-22-115, C.R.S.

Reduce the Dental Care Act Funding

Proposal:

The Department of Public Health and Environment proposes to eliminate \$520,131 General Fund from the Dental Assistance Program for Seniors in FY 2009-10. This General Fund appropriation reimburses costs for dental care provided to eligible seniors. Although this program has no other source of funding and will no longer be able to provide dental services for seniors, historic underfunding has only allowed the program to serve 2.3% of the eligible population (25,000 seniors). This proposal reduces \$520,131 General Fund in FY 2010-11.

Summary of Request:

- The Dental Assistance Program for Seniors provides reimbursement for dental procedures and appliances for seniors who qualify under the Old Age Pension Program and who see a participating dental care provider. This financial assistance is given to dental providers for services they provide to the eligible seniors.
- The statewide need/eligible population for senior services of this type is 25,000 but the program has served only 580 seniors a year¹. Based on the national utilization rate for these services, it is estimated that 60% of eligible seniors (15,000 people) would seek services. In order to serve 15,000 seniors, the program would need a total of \$8,324,550.
- Elimination of General Fund for this program will remove financial assistance for seniors who qualify under the Old Age Pension Program.
- Retaining the \$59,225 General Fund in Personal Services costs in this line item will allow the
 Department to retain the federal funds/grant related to provider loan repayment services due to a federal
 match requirement. These funds provide approximately 3-6 providers with school loan repayment
 assistance. Of the federal grant, \$225,000 is used for student loan repayment services and the
 remaining \$90,000 in federal funding is used for additional workforce development such as provider
 training etc.

¹For FY 2008-09 the Dental Assistance Program served approximately 580 seniors. Historically, the program serves approximately 800 seniors. This service reduction in FY 2008-09 was due to contractor non-compliance issues for which the Department did not provide payment. Of the General Fund withheld from the contract provider in FY 2008-09, \$192,896 was reverted for FY 2008-09.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

Statutes dictate that this program be executed subject to available appropriations. As a result, an Executive Order is required to stop the program until the appropriation can be changed as a result of this budget action request. No statutory change is currently required.

Article 21 (2009) Dental Care

25-21-102. Legislative declaration.

(1) It is the purpose of this article to promote the public health and welfare of the people of Colorado by providing an alternative to the present Medicaid system which will furnish necessary dental appliances and services to individuals sixty years of age or older whose income and resources are insufficient to meet the costs of such appliances and services, thereby enabling individuals and families to attain or retain their capabilities for independence and self-care. (2) The objectives of this article shall be implemented through various executive departments, agencies, and political subdivisions of the state in cooperation with private individuals and organizations.

25-21-104. Dental assistance program for seniors.

Dental assistance program for seniors. (1) Subject to available appropriations, the department shall award service grants to qualified grantees for the purpose of providing dental and oral health services, including relief for pain and infection, oral cancer screening, dentures, denture maintenance and repair, and related dental services to eligible seniors in Colorado. In awarding service grants, the department shall consider the recommendations and advice of the advisory committee. If the department decides not to accept the recommendations of the advisory committee, the department shall state, in writing, the reasons for not accepting the recommendations. (2) The department shall: (a) Develop rules, procedures, and application forms to govern how service grants shall be awarded. Such rules shall include: (I) Outreach requirements; (II) Coordination with area agencies on aging. (b) Accept grant applications from grantees to provide dental and oral health services as described in subsection (1) of this section; (c) Contract with qualified grantees that are awarded a service grant to provide dental and oral health services to eligible seniors or

to administer funds for the provision of such services through sub-grants, awards, or reimbursement processes that comply with the federal "Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996", 42 U.S.C. sec. 1320d to 1320d-8; (d) Develop a monitoring procedure to assure that service grants are used to provide dental and oral health services to eligible seniors and that grantees are verifying the eligibility of the seniors served in the program for the old age pension program; (e) In awarding grants, give priority to grantees who can demonstrate the ability to leverage additional resources. (3) The department may seek alternatives for program administration and funding, including applying for federal waivers.

25-21-105. Copayments – fees- rules

(1) Nothing in this article shall preclude a grantee from charging an eligible senior a co-payment, but any co-payment assessed shall not exceed twenty percent of the cost of the services provided. (2) to (4) (Deleted by amendment, L. 2003, p. 2042, § 3, effective July 1, 2003.) (5) (Deleted by amendment, L. 2008, p. 353, § 1, effective August 5, 2008.) (6) The state board of health created in section 25-1-103 shall promulgate rules regarding allowable procedures and fees pursuant to this article based upon recommendations of the dental advisory committee created in section 25-21-107.5. The allowable procedures for which fees may be set shall include, but not be limited to, oral examination (diagnosis and treatment planning); emergency treatment (palliative); X rays - full mouth (periapical or panorex); X rays - bite wing; prophylaxis; full dentures, upper and lower, including adjustments; single, full, or acrylic partial dentures, including adjustments; repair of fractured dentures; replacement or repair of broken teeth; addition of teeth to a partial denture to replace a natural tooth; replacement of clasp, clasp intact; replacement of clasp, new clasp; removal of permanent teeth; surgical removal; reline (chairside); reline (laboratory processed); jump rebase (laboratory processed); partial dentures (chrome base cast); amalgam fillings (per surface); composite (per surface); periodontal treatment; and soft tissue treatment (surgical).

25-21-107.7. Program funding.

The general assembly shall make annual appropriations to the department for service grants and for the payment of administrative costs of the dental assistance program. A grantee's administrative costs shall not exceed ten percent of the grant amount awarded.

Name of Fund: Tobacco Education Program Fund (18M)

Purpose of Fund: This Fund is used to reduce the initiation of tobacco use by children, promote cessation and reduce exposure to second hand smoke. The funds are to be used for evidence based grant programs only. This Fund is Amendment 35 protected and 16% of the annual Amendment 35 tobacco tax revenue is currently deposited into this fund.

Impact of Recommended Reduction:

Diverting funds from the Tobacco Education Programs Cash Fund will limit the funds available for the Department of Public Health and Environment to distribute to local health providers for contract services. These contract services include tobacco cessation and general tobacco education programs.

Assumptions:

The current balance in the Tobacco Education Cash Fund is approximately \$2.5 million. This entire amount can be utilized for a refinance since all FY 2008-09 required transfers have already occurred. Additionally, in FY 2009-10, revenue is anticipated to be approximately \$26.5 million. There is an \$8 million diversion already accounted for in Senate Bill 09-271 and another \$6.8 million obligated for other purposes (Department of Health Care Policy Financing and other contracts and personal services obligation) which would leave approximately \$14.2 million in the fund for FY 2009-10. The entire \$14.2 million anticipated for an ending balance in FY 2009-10 could be diverted or utilized for refinance purposes. However, the Department and the Office of State Planning and Budgeting request to utilize \$7 million from the fund in order to refinance General Fund Medicaid costs within the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing.

Under Amendment 35, tobacco tax funds can be used to offset General Fund which is appropriated for health-related purposes upon declaration of a fiscal emergency as deemed by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the General Assembly. Senate Joint Resolution 09-035 passed by a two thirds (2/3) vote and declared the fiscal emergency for FY 2009-10. This refinance will operate under this fiscal emergency as well. As criteria, under Senate Bill 09-271, Amendment 35 funds were used for Medicaid expenses to offset General Fund and are again being requested for the same purpose.

It is anticipated that Amendment-35 brings in approximately \$180 Million annually with 46% going to the Health Care Policy and Financing Health Care Expansion Fund, 19% to the Health Care Policy and Financing Primary Care Fund, 16% to Department of Public Health and Environment Tobacco Education, and 16% to Department of Public Health and Environment Prevention, Early Detection, and Treatment Fund, and 3% to the General Fund for health-related purposes.

The entire \$7 million cash balance amount identified in this request has already been issued in grants to local providers. As a result of this request and corresponding budget action, the Department will have to rescind those grant awards. For the grants that will be rescinded, the Department will make recommendations to the respective review committees and they will make final decisions. Once those decisions are made, modified contracts/purchase orders will be issued to the affected grantees.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

These funds are for evidence based grant programs only and are constitutionally protected through Amendment 35 language. Any excess funds need to be diverted to refinance another health related state cost and could not simply be transferred to the General Fund. Statutes will need to be adjusted by a bill to reflect the new funding diverted from the fund in FY 2009-10.

The Governor will limit the funds for the tobacco education programs through an executive order and a restriction on the appropriation. The appropriation to the various programs which receive funds from the Tobacco Education cash fund will need to be revised based on this budget request as noted in the Schedule 13 for the related long bill line item.

Section 24-22-117, C.R.S. (2008);

- (c) (I) The tobacco education programs fund to be administered by the department of public health and environment. The state treasurer and the controller shall transfer an amount equal to sixteen percent of the moneys deposited into the cash fund, plus sixteen percent of the interest earned on those moneys, to the tobacco education programs fund. All interest derived from the deposit and investment of moneys in the tobacco education programs fund shall be credited to the tobacco education programs fund. Any unexpended and unencumbered moneys remaining in the tobacco education programs fund at the end of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not be credited or transferred to the general fund or any other fund.
- (II) The interest derived from the deposit and investment of moneys in the tobacco education programs fund may be used to give credit to a wholesaler or distributor for taxes paid on cigarettes or other tobacco products that are bad debts pursuant to sections 39-28-104 and 39-28.5-107, C.R.S.; except that the interest earned on the tobacco education programs fund shall be used only for that portion of the bad debt attributable to the taxes imposed pursuant to section 21 of article X of the state constitution.
- (III) For fiscal year 2005-06 and each fiscal year thereafter, moneys in the tobacco education programs fund shall be annually appropriated by the general assembly as follows:
- (A) To the prevention services division of the department of public health and environment for the tobacco education, prevention, and cessation programs specified in part 8 of article <u>3.5</u> of title <u>25</u>, C.R.S.; and
- (B) Up to three hundred fifty thousand dollars to the division of liquor enforcement in the department of revenue for the purpose of enforcing laws relating to the sale of tobacco to minors.

Proposed Cash Fund Financing

Name of Fund: Prevention, Early Detection and Treatment Fund (18N)

Purpose of Fund: This cash fund provides grants to local entities/agencies for prevention related activities including funds for breast and cervical transfer screenings. Grants typically run in three year cycles. 16% of Amendment 35 tobacco tax revenue goes into this fund on an annual basis.

Impact of Recommended Reduction:

Diverting funds from the Prevention, Early Detection and Treatment Fund would limit the funds available for the Department of Public Health and Environment to distribute to local health providers for contract services.

Assumptions:

The Current balance in the Prevention, Early Detection and Treatment cash fund is approximately \$20 million at the end of FY 2008-09 which can be diverted or used for refinance purposes. FY 2009-10 revenues are anticipated to be \$22.5 million and there is a FY 2009-10 obligation of \$17 million (including a \$12 million transfer due to SB 09-271 and approximately \$5 million for other purposes such as a transfer to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, breast and cervical cancer screening and treatment etc). This will leave the fund with approximately \$25.5 million at the end of FY 2009-10. The Department and the Office of State Planning and Budgeting request that \$7 million from the Prevention, Early Detection and Treatment cash fund be utilized to refinance General Fund Medicaid costs within the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing for FY 2009-10.

Under Amendment 35, tobacco tax funds can be used to offset General Fund which is appropriated for health-related purposes upon declaration of a fiscal emergency as deemed by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the General Assembly. Senate Joint Resolution 09-035 passed by a two thirds (2/3) vote and declared the fiscal emergency for FY 2009-10. This refinance will operate under this fiscal emergency as well. As criteria, under Senate Bill 09-271, Amendment 35 funds were used for Medicaid expenses to offset General Fund and are again being requested for the same purpose.

It is anticipated that Amendment-35 brings in approximately \$180 Million annually with 46% going to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing's Health Care Expansion Fund, 19% to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing's Primary Care Fund, 16% to Department of Public Health and Environment Tobacco Education, and 16% to the Department of Public Health and Environment's Prevention, Early Detection, and Treatment Fund, and 3% to the General Fund for health-related purposes.

The entire \$7 million cash balance amount identified in this request has already been issued in grants to local providers. As a result of this request and corresponding budget action, the Department will have to rescind those grant awards. For the grants that will be rescinded, the Department will make

recommendations to the respective review committees and they will make final decisions. Once those decisions are made, modified contracts/purchase orders will be issued to the affected grantees.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

Amendment 35 funds can be diverted to health related programs (for refinance) but not simply transferred to General Fund and the funds are to be used for evidence based grant programs only. Transfers from this fund would require a statutory change. This Fund is Amendment 35 protected and 16% of the annual Amendment 35 tobacco tax revenue is currently deposited into this fund.

An Executive Order will need to be issued by the Governor in order to limit the funds for the programs supported by this cash fund as statutes require that funding be annually appropriated to prevention related programs. The appropriation for the Prevention Services Division, specifically related to Cancer, Cardiovascular Disease, and Pulmonary Disease Grants will need to be reduced however, the statutes do not need to be amended.

Statutory authority is located within Section 24-22-117 (2) (d) C.R.S.(2008):

- (d) (I) The prevention, early detection, and treatment fund to be administered by the department of public health and environment. The state treasurer and the controller shall transfer an amount equal to sixteen percent of the moneys deposited into the cash fund, plus sixteen percent of the interest earned on those moneys, to the prevention, early detection, and treatment fund. All interest derived from the deposit and investment of moneys in the prevention, early detection, and treatment fund shall be credited to the prevention, early detection, and treatment fund. Any unexpended and unencumbered moneys remaining in the prevention, early detection, and treatment fund at the end of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not be credited or transferred to the general fund or any other fund. The moneys in the prevention, early detection, and treatment fund shall be annually appropriated by the general assembly to the department of public health and environment for allocation by the department consistent with the provisions of this paragraph (d).
- (II) Of the moneys appropriated annually by the general assembly to the department of public health and environment pursuant to subparagraph (I) of this paragraph (d), moneys shall be annually allocated by the department of public health and environment for breast and cervical cancer screenings pursuant to section 25-4-1505, C.R.S., and transferred to the department of health care policy and financing for the breast and cervical cancer treatment program established in section 25.5-5-308, C.R.S., in the following amounts not to exceed five million dollars in any fiscal year.

Any excess funds would need to be diverted to refinance another health related state cost and could not simply be transferred to the General Fund. As noted above, statutes may need to be changed/amended by a bill to update the funding diverted from the fund in FY 2009-10.

Name of Fund: Health Disparities Grant Program Fund (19F)

Purpose of Fund: This Fund is used provide grants to local communities to improve the health status of minority and ethnic populations impacted by health disparities. For example, certain ethnic groups are more prone to diabetes or high blood pressure than other populations. These funds are used to target those disparities and reduce the health impacts to the citizens. The funds are to be used for evidence based grant programs only. This Fund is Amendment 35 protected and 15 % of the annual Amendment 35 tobacco tax revenue that is deposited to the Prevention, Early Detection and Treatment Fund is deposited into this fund as reappropriated funds (2.4% of the total Amendment 35 revenue is deposited into the Health Disparities Grant Program Fund).

Impact of Recommended Reduction:

Diverting funds from the Health Disparities Grant Program Fund would limit the funds available for the Department of Public Health and Environment to distribute to local health providers for contract services. These contract services include programs designed to mitigate health disparities in minority populations.

Assumptions:

The balance in the Health Disparities Grant Program Fund is approximately \$4.0 million (at the end of FY 2008-09). Additionally, in FY 2009-10, revenue is anticipated to be approximately \$3.9 million. There is \$5.5 million obligated for other purposes (contracts and personal services obligation) which leaves approximately \$2.4 million in the fund for FY 2009-10. The Department and the Office of State Planning and Budgeting recommend utilizing \$1 million of the fund for FY 2009-10 to refinance General Fund within the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing for Medical Services Premiums and leaving \$1.4 Million in the cash fund for FY 2009-10 to allow for any continuation grants in future years.

Under Amendment 35, tobacco tax funds can be used to offset General Fund which is appropriated for health-related purposes upon declaration of a fiscal emergency as deemed by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the General Assembly. Senate Joint Resolution 09-035 passed by a two thirds (2/3) vote and declared the fiscal emergency for FY 2009-10. This refinance will operate under this fiscal emergency as well. As criteria, under Senate Bill 09-271, Amendment 35 funds were used for Medicaid expenses to offset General Fund and are again being requested for the same purpose.

It is anticipated that Amendment-35 brings in approximately \$180 Million annually with 46% going to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing's Health Care Expansion Fund, 19% to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing's Primary Care Fund, 16% to the Department of Public Health and Environment for Tobacco Education, and 16% to the Department of Public Health and Environment's Prevention, Early Detection, and Treatment Fund, and 3% to the General Fund for health-related purposes. The Health Disparities Grant Program Fund receives 15% of the money deposited in the Prevention, Early Detection, and Treatment Fund.

The \$1,000,000 reappropriated fund balance identified in this request has not yet been issued in grants to providers/programs. The Health Disparities Program has been conservative in issuing grants in order to ensure funding is available in future years.

Current Statutory Authority or Needed Statutory Change:

A Governor's Executive Order will limit the appropriations to grant program as the statutes dictate that funding be appropriated annually for this program. The appropriation will be revised due to this requested budget action, therefore, no statutory change is required.

Section 24-22-117 C.R.S.(2008),

(f) The health disparities grant program fund to be administered by the department of public health and environment. Moneys shall be transferred to the health disparities grant program fund as described in subparagraph (III) of paragraph (d) of this subsection (2). All interest derived from the deposit and investment of moneys in the health disparities grant program fund shall be credited to the health disparities grant program fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered moneys remaining in the health disparities grant program fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not be credited to the general fund or any other fund. The moneys in the health disparities grant program fund shall be annually appropriated by the general assembly to the department of public health and environment for allocation by the department of public health and environment consistent with the provisions of paragraph (d) of this subsection (2).
