



What is the Colorado Medicaid Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (BCCP)?

BCCP is a Medicaid program for women who have been diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer at certain screening clinics called Women’s Wellness Connection (WWC) sites. BCCP also covers breast and cervical conditions that may lead to cancer if not treated.

Who is eligible?

Women who:

- Have been diagnosed through a WWC site or other recognized provider*;
- Are between 40 and 64 years old;
- Have an income less than 250% of the Federal Poverty Level;
- Have not had a mammogram or pap smear test in the last year;
- Do not have health insurance or the insurance does not cover breast or cervical cancer treatment;
- Are not currently enrolled in Medicaid and are not eligible for Medicare; and
- Are U.S. citizens or have been legal permanent residents for at least five years.

What services/benefits are available?

All Medicaid services are available, including breast reconstruction after breast cancer surgery.

Where are services/benefits available?

Women may see any Medicaid provider, after being diagnosed through WWC. To find nearby Medicaid providers call 303-866-3513 in the Denver metro area or toll-free 1-800-221-3943 or visit the Department website.

When does BCCP coverage end?

Coverage ends when women:

- Get other insurance that covers treatment for breast or cervical cancer
- Are eligible for another Medicaid program
- Turn 65
- Do not send in the renewal packet on time
- Refuse treatment or do not start treatment within the first three months in the program
- Have completed active treatment for breast or cervical cancer

How does an individual or family apply?

The WWC site will help eligible women apply.
