# S-04, BA-03 -FY 2009-10 Higher Education Budget Balancing Reduction - Part 3

## Proposal:

On December 18, 2009, the Governor's Office of State Planning and Budgeting and the Legislative Council presented their revenue forecasts. These forecasts project the need for additional budget balancing action to be taken in the current year (FY 2009-10) and therefore the Department seeks an additional General Fund reduction to the governing boards, local district colleges, and the area vocational schools of an additional \$5,500,000. The Department recommends that this reduction be fully backfilled with federal State Fiscal Stabilization Funds (SFSF) from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). This reduction as recommended impacts federal funding and reduces by \$5,500,000 the amount of SFSF funds available in FY 2010-11. This reduction is reflected in the corresponding Schedule 13.

State support for the governing boards, local district colleges, and the area vocational schools has been reduced significantly in an effort to balance the state budget. To date, each of the cuts in FY 2008-09 and FY 2009-10 have been fully backfilled with federal stimulus dollars from the Education Stabilization Fund of the State Fiscal Stabilization Fund allocated from ARRA. The net effect of this refinancing is a reduction in the SFSF funds available in FY 2010-11, the year in which the governing boards, local district colleges, and the area vocational schools will experience effective cuts to their state/federal funding.

The Department's request is the fourth FY 2009-10 General Fund reduction and refinancing to the institutions of higher education in this economic downturn (since December 2008) and is in response to projections of available revenue in the Legislative Council staff's December 2009 revenue forecast.

Three of these reductions have been recommended to date in FY 2009-10, since the close of the 2009 legislative session. In total, the General Fund reduction from both the August 25, 2009 and the December 1, 2009 requests results in a total reduction of \$226,153,668 in FY 2009-10. With this recommendation, the institutions of higher education will have been reduced \$231,653,668 from their original FY 2009-10 appropriation (see table below).

## **Summary of Request:**

The \$5,500,000 proposed General Fund reduction to the institutions of higher education is in addition to the reductions detailed in the August 25, 2009 FY 2009-10 "ES-01" request and the December 1, 2009 FY 2009-10 "ES-02" request. The additional \$5,500,000 General Fund reduction in FY 2009-10 is allocated in an across-the-board manner. This was accomplished through allocating the reduction based on each institution's respective percentage share of the total December 1, 2009 General Fund (ES-02) amount. This percentage is multiplied by a negative \$5.5 million which results in the General Fund reductions identified above. The General Fund reduction that is experienced by each institution in FY 2009-10 is fully restored with the federal stimulus funding from the Education Stabilization Fund (identified as ARRA in the table).

The \$5,301,997 General Fund reduction to the Governing Boards is in the fee-for-service contracts from the College Opportunity Fund. The table on page 4 identifies these changes. Additionally, a history of the requests for FY 2009-10 is identified on page 5 of this narrative.

### **FY 2010-11 Impact:**

The result of this recommendation is a further reduction of \$5,500,000 in ARRA federal funds available in FY 2010-11. The decreases in ARRA federal funds in FY 2010-11, were \$55,981,956 in the November 6, 2009 budget request. This \$55,981,956 amount took into consideration the \$80.9 million and \$145 million General Fund reductions and ARRA backfill from the August 25<sup>th</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup> reductions, respectively. Since an additional use of ARRA funds in FY 2009-10 due to this request there is also a reduction of \$5,500,000, which makes the total ARRA federal fund reduction \$61,481,956 in FY 2010-11. This reduction is reflected in the budget amendment column of the attached Schedule 13 and the table on page 6. For a history of the ARRA funds in FY 2010-11 please see the table on page 7.

#### Schedule 13:

The Schedule 13 for this request is incremental in FY 2009-10 and is cumulative in FY 2010-11 as a budget amendment. As such the column 3 amount only reflects the changes in this "S-04" while the cumulative impact on the institutions of higher education is ES-02 (which incorporates ES-01) plus S-04, as noted in the table on page 5. For FY 2010-11 there is a budget amendment impact to the November 6, 2009 "BRI-01" request identified in column 8 (BA-03).

This request is part of the January 27, 2010 FY 2009-10 budget balancing package. No "letternote revised text" changes have been identified in this request as the February Census for enrollments and stipend eligible populations for higher education will change the stipend and fee-for-service splits for the governing boards. In February 2010, OSPB will submit the final higher Education request. At that time, the revised "letternotes" will be submitted accounting for this request and for both FY 2009-10 and FY 2010-11 stipend eligible populations.

#### **Future Issues:**

The methodologies used in the August 25, 2009 budget balancing proposal for FY 2009-10, the December 1, 2009 budget balancing proposal for FY 2009-10, and in this January 27, 2010 proposal will not be the basis for future increases or decreases. Any adjustments to state funding for institutions of higher education in future fiscal years will be addressed without regard to these methodologies. Additionally, the Governor may decide to revise this January 27, 2010 FY 2009-10 request pursuant to future General Fund revenue forecasts.

The table below illustrates the FY 2009-10 Changes to the College Opportunity Fund fee-for-service contract as a result of the January 27, 2010 General Fund reduction.

Please note this table only identifies the Governing Boards and their respective financing through the College Opportunity Fund; the total amounts do not include the Local District Junior Colleges or the Area Vocational Schools.

College Opportunity Fund and Governing Boards

No statutory change or Executive Order is required to implement these proposed reductions for the College Opportunity Fund, the Local District Junior College or the Area Vocational Schools. The statutes do not mandate these specific programs. Therefore, this budget action can be accomplished by applying a restriction on the appropriation, without an executive order or statutory change. However, a budget action is requested to revise the appropriation so the restriction can be removed. Accompanying statutory language for these line-items is provided below.

## College Opportunity Fund and Governing Boards (fee-for-service contracts)

• Section 23-5-130 (2) C.R.S. (2009). Beginning July 1, 2005, the governing board of a state institution of higher education may annually negotiate a fee-for-service contract with the department for the delivery of higher education services by the institutions to the residents of the state of Colorado...

# Local District Junior Colleges

• Section 23-71-301 (1) (a), C.R.S. (2009). Direct grants to junior college districts – occupational courses. Any junior college district operating or organized and operating as such during the entire school year in which a grant is made shall be entitled to a direct grant, from funds appropriated for this purpose, in an amount specified annually by the general assembly...

## Area Vocational Schools

• Section 23-71-303 (1), C.R.S. (2009). Any area vocational school operating or organized and operating as such during the entire school year may be reimbursed by the state in an annual amount specified annual by the general assembly...

## Federal Legislation

- American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 State Fiscal Stabilization Fund Maintenance-of-Effort Waiver Criteria<sup>1</sup> The percentage of the total State revenues used to support elementary, secondary and public institutions of higher education for 2010 is at least as great as the percentage of the total State revenues used to support elementary, secondary and public higher education in FY 2009.
- American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 State Fiscal Stabilization Fund Guidance<sup>2</sup> III-B-1. What levels of State support must a Governor restore for elementary and secondary education and public institutions of higher education?
  - o For public institutions of higher education, a State must also restore the levels of State support (excluding tuition and fees paid by the students) to the greater of FY 2008 or FY 2009 levels of support.
- American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 State Fiscal Stabilization Fund Guidance<sup>3</sup> III-B-7. How does a State calculate the amounts of Stabilization funds that must be awarded to local education agencies and to public institutions of higher education?
  - o If there are any Education Stabilization funds remaining after a State determines the amounts that LEAs and public IHEs will receive on the basis of the FY 2009 restoration calculations, the State then determines, on the basis of the FY 2010 restoration calculations (taking into account any increases or adjustments referenced in Question III-B-1), the amount of the remaining funds that will be awarded to LEAs and IHEs in order to restore the levels of State support for elementary and secondary education and for public IHEs for FY 2010. Next, it restores the levels of State support for FY 2011.
