

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FORTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

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We submit herewith our Forty-Sixth Annual Report showing the assessed valuation of the various classes of property together with the valuations, levies and revenue for county, school and municipal purposes in each county of the State.

STATE VALUATION

As provided in C. R. S. 137-6-31 and C. R. S. 137-6-32 the Colorado Tax Commission, under date of September 9, 1957, reported to the State Board of Equalization that it had examined the abstracts of assessment filed by the sixty-three county assessors of Colorado.

The abstracts as filed show the aggregate assessed valuation of all property within the state to be \$3,148,267,573 an increase of \$80,016,693 or 2.61% over 1956.

Real and personal property assessed by the County Assessors for the year 1957 amounts to \$2,777,700,553, an increase of \$56,783,023, or 2.09% over 1956.

Utility property assessed by the Tax Commission amounts to \$370,567,020, an increase of \$23,233,670, or 6.69% over 1956. This increase was distributed to 52 of the 63 counties. Denver, Adams, Jefferson, Arapahoe, El Paso, Mesa and Pueblo received the largest increases. 11 counties showed slight decreases in utility values amounting to \$235,200. Mountain States Telephone &

Telegraph Company showed largest dollar increase of \$8,123,170, followed by Public Service Company at \$6,240,130. Pacific Northwest Pipe Line Company showed largest percentage increase 50.24%, followed by United Air Lines at 29.53%. Colorado Central Power Company 26% and American Telephone & Telegraph Company 25.71%. The 67.82% increase on Kansas Nebraska Natural Gas Company is due to consolidation of companies, rather than expansion.

Jefferson County shows largest dollar increase of \$19,057,380 followed by Adams \$14,190,370; El Paso \$11,375,550; Rio Blanco \$8,998,585; Arapahoe \$8,315,820; Boulder \$8,014,250; Jackson County shows the largest percentage increase 16.09%.

26 counties show loss in total valuation ranging from \$619 in Elbert County to \$3,779,925 in Logan County.

Passage of H. B. No. 4 exempting non revenue producing personal property from assessment resulted in a net loss of \$88,090,416 in the state, the greatest loss being in Denver County amounting to \$51,611,290; Denver County showed a total net loss of \$455,450, regaining the loss on personal property on Lots and Improvements, Merchandise and Utilities.

Most counties allowed five year depreciation on improvements as set up in the original plan when appraisal values were first entered on tax rolls in 1952. This depreciation approximating 10% on buildings entitled to it, reduced the assessed values to an extent quite noticeable in some counties. On Farm and Ranch Improvements 30 counties show an increase and 31 show a decrease, net increase amounting to \$4,530,240. Commercial Improvements on Rural Lands in 34 counties show an increase, 24 show a loss, net gain in state \$6,016,957. Industrial Improvements on rural lands in 32 counties show an increase, 17 show a loss, net gain in state \$9,276,319.

Farm Lands showed a reduction of \$818,699 due largely to conversion of land into subdivisions with corresponding reclassification, rather than a reduction in base values per acre.

Several Assessors revalued lots in 1957 while allowing depreciation on improvements, this with creation of subdivisions resulted in an increase of \$14,360,321.

Residential Improvements on lots showed the largest gain of any class of property amounting to \$60,487,393. Greatest per-

cent of this increase is in Denver, Jefferson, Adams, Boulder and Arapahoe Counties.

Commercial Improvements on lots showed a loss of \$8,307,700 due to depreciation and classifying of some properties as Industrial that were formerly Commercial.

Industrial Improvements showed a substantial gain of \$17,896,161 principally in Denver, Adams, Las Animas and Otero Counties.

Las Animas County showed a net loss of \$454,430 on Farm Lands, Urban Lands and Improvements, but increased Coal Lands \$732,940 to result in a net gain on all Real Estate of \$374,780.

Oil and Gas Production shows an increase of \$7,690,780. Rio Blanco and Moffat Counties in Rangely Field show an increase of \$8,305,315; Jackson County shows an increase of \$1,033,740; Northeastern oil field showed a substantial decrease: \$3,061,516 in Logan County, \$1,737,170 in Morgan County, while Washington County showed an increase of \$2,017,655.

Output of Metalliferous Mines shows a substantial decrease of \$3,216,417. Lake County showed a loss of \$3,967,725, Eagle County \$760,702, Montrose County shows largest increase amounting to \$1,202,470.

Mineral Reserves show an increase of \$955,196, of this \$704,975 is in Cheyenne County and is due to assessor doubling assessed value per acre rather than any substantial increase in acreage.

Grand total Real Estate and Improvements shows an increase of \$113,989,272, or 5.362%.

Only ten counties show an increase in valuation of cattle amounting to \$373,213, of this \$151,098 is in Elbert County. Net loss in the state amounts to \$1,848,198, greatest losses occurring in Baca, Gunnison, Kiowa, Kit Carson, Lincoln, Mesa, Prowers and Saguache Counties.

Valuation of sheep did not vary as much as cattle, 33 counties show an increase, 29 a loss, with a net increase of \$35,799 in the state.

Livestock fed in transit show an increase of \$337,566, greatest increase being in Weld and Otero Counties.

Tractors and Combines show a loss of \$505,464. Agricultural Implements, Machinery and Harness show a slight increase of \$226,434.

Store, Hotel and Office Furniture & Fixtures show an increase of \$4,265,892, due in part to Assessors placing some properties in this classification that were formerly listed under "Household Furnishings".

Efforts to achieve a better assessment of Merchandise are being made to show results in the \$22,923,382, or 9.93% increase on this class of property, largely in Denver, Adams, Jefferson, Pueblo, Mesa and Arapahoe Counties.

Industrial Construction Machinery, Mining and Oil Field Equipment show a substantial gain of \$10,148,090, largely in Denver, El Paso, Garfield, Montrose and Lake Counties.

All Personal Property showed a net loss of \$57,206,249, largely due to exemption of Household Properties; 12 counties showing an increase and 51 showed a loss.


