**FIFTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT**  
of the  
**COLORADO TAX COMMISSION**  
to the  
**GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE**

We submit herewith our fifty-fourth annual report showing the assessed valuation of the various classes of property, together with the valuation, levies, and revenues for the state and each of its political subdivisions.

**STATE VALUATION**

The valuation of the state for the year 1965 as set by the State Board of Equalization is \$4,088,361,930. This is an increase of \$101,454,423 or 2.54 percent over 1964.

Locally assessed real estate totals \$3,073,265,678, an increase of \$91,813,475 or 3.08 percent over 1964.

Locally assessed personal property totals \$554,652,922, an increase of \$4,328,508 or .79 percent over 1964.

Public utilities or state assessed property totals \$460,443,330, an increase of \$5,312,440 or 1.167 percent over 1964.

Fifty counties show overall increases, Arapahoe county showing the most increase amounting to \$15,380,155. Jefferson County showed the next largest increase of \$15,336,800. Loss in utility value in Arapahoe County was \$1,764,755 compared to \$2,861,420 loss in Jefferson County, resulting in a net increase in assessor's assessment of \$18,198,220 in Jefferson County and \$17,144,910 in Arapahoe County. Other counties showing substantial overall increases are, El Paso \$14,485,519, Larimer County \$13,636,643, Denver County \$8,418,410 and Boulder County \$7,654,273.

Clear Creek County shows the largest overall increase percentagewise of 18.628% with 14.021% increase by the assessor. Pitkin County shows an overall percentage of 13.015% with 11.272% by assessor. Other counties showing increases by assessor were: Eagle, Larimer, San Miguel, Routt and Chaffee Counties.

Thirteen counties show losses in overall valuation. Those showing substantial losses are, Washington County with \$2,819,591, Morgan County with \$2,426,751, Rio Blanco County with \$988,492, Moffat County with \$762,346, and Logan County with \$760,566. Lowered oil production accounts for the greater percent of loss in all of these counties. Eight other counties show

minor losses in real estate and improvements. Montrose County had a loss of \$941,040 in output of metalliferous mines but gained in utilities and other real estate.

Residential improvements and lots account for the greatest percent of increase in assessment of real estate. Loss in oil production accounts for the greatest loss.

Thirty-five counties show losses in assessment of personal property. Those showing the greatest reductions are, Morgan with \$1,905,700, Logan County with \$1,213,480, Rio Blanco County with \$922,297, Moffat County with \$808,200, Lincoln County with \$537,440. Oil drilling machinery and equipment account for the greatest percent of loss. Kit Carson, Lincoln, Washington, Crowley and Elbert Counties show the most loss on cattle.

Merchandise assessment varied considerably over 1964, the overall value being slightly more than last year. Denver County shows an increase of \$4,582,000, Pueblo County \$943,150, El Paso County \$895,150, and Larimer County with \$759,940 on this class of property. Counties showing substantial increases in assessment of personal property are, Denver County \$3,556,270, Jefferson County \$1,845,320, Pueblo County \$1,633,005, Larimer County \$1,222,300, and Boulder County with \$831,470.

Fifty-three counties show an increase in utility value amounting to \$17,743,776. Weld, Routt, Montrose, Clear Creek, Prowers and Larimer Counties are the six counties showing the largest increases, ranging from \$703,663 in Larimer County to \$2,378,197 in Weld County. These increases are due primarily to change in the law in distribution of telephone values and substantial increase in Colorado Ute Electric Association valuation, this last affecting Routt County in particular. Ten counties show a total loss in utility value of \$12,431,336 due almost entirely to change in distribution of telephone company values. Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, El Paso, Jefferson and Pueblo received the greatest losses, ranging from \$1,429,931 in El Paso County to \$2,933,151 in Adams County.

Railroad companies show a loss of \$1,165,640, or 1.21 percent. Air line companies show a loss of \$893,280 or 7.309 percent. Electric power companies show an increase of \$540,750 or .36 percent. Gas companies show an increase of \$752,770 or 7.27 percent. Gas pipe line carrier companies show a loss of \$2,315,870 or 7.54 percent. Rural electric companies show an increase of \$3,681,270 or 17.495 percent. Telegraph companies were decreased. Telephone companies were increased by \$5,043,750 or 4.095 percent. Domestic water companies show a loss of \$203,520 or 13.999 percent, which is more than accounted for in Leadville Water Company being taken over by a municipal water district. This company was assessed at \$209,130 in 1964. Pipe line companies and miscellaneous companies' assessments

varied very little from 1964 assessment. Generally speaking, utility and railroad properties were equalized at 33½ percent of "actual value" working towards 30 percent in 1967 in conformity with provisions of chapter 94, 1964 Session Laws.

The Commission considered 66 applications of school districts to increase revenue by more than 5 percent. Four applications to incur bonded indebtedness subject to favorable elections, aggregating \$2,684,000, were approved.

284 applications for determining the tax exempt eligibility of religious, charitable, and educational properties were received by the Commission, of which 182 were granted, 57 denied, 5 returned, 18 were allowed in part and 22 are in the process of investigation.

1,194 petitions for abatement or refund of taxes were received. 1,184 amounting to \$824,479.86 were approved and 10 totaling \$667.07 were denied.

The 1965 taxes to be collected total \$284,220,173.00.

In 1964 the amount was \$278,480,284.00.

In 1955 property taxes amounted to \$133,624,193.00.

In 1945 property taxes amounted to \$47,213,502.00.

#### APPRAISAL DIVISION REPORT FOR 1965

The Commercial and Industrial Replacement Cost Manual was issued in February 1965. Five regional schools were held which were attended by almost all of the assessors and their staffs.

In August, the Rural Improvement Real Estate Cost Manual and Recreational Structures Cost Manual were issued. The Urban Land Manual was issued in June, and the Rural Land Manual was issued in October. Five regional schools were held throughout the State as a follow-up training program on the Residential and Personal Property Manuals previously released. A total of eleven Cost Manuals were released, which completes our program.

The Sixth Annual School for County Assessors was held at the University of Colorado in October 1965. The session lasted 5½ days and offered options in Basic, Personal Property I, Real Property I (Residential) and Real Property II (Commercial). This was the fourth year in the three-year certification program.

One hundred and seventy-seven students were enrolled, of whom 121 passed the examinations and were awarded certificates. 57 students passed the Basic; 28 passed Real Property I; 28 passed Real Property II; and 8 students passed Personal Property I. In addition, 24 students completed the three-year course and were awarded certificates as Certified Tax Appraisers.



Commencing with the Second Annual School, all of the schools have met the requirements for endorsement by the International Association of Assessing Officers, and such endorsement has been obtained.

The Appraisal Division has assisted in efforts to settle court cases in various counties. Due to new legislation, requests for assistance from assessors have increased. This has caused staff reorganization along geographic lines.

Mr. Anthony G. Ferraro was certified as the new Director of Appraisals and assumed his duties in August 1965.

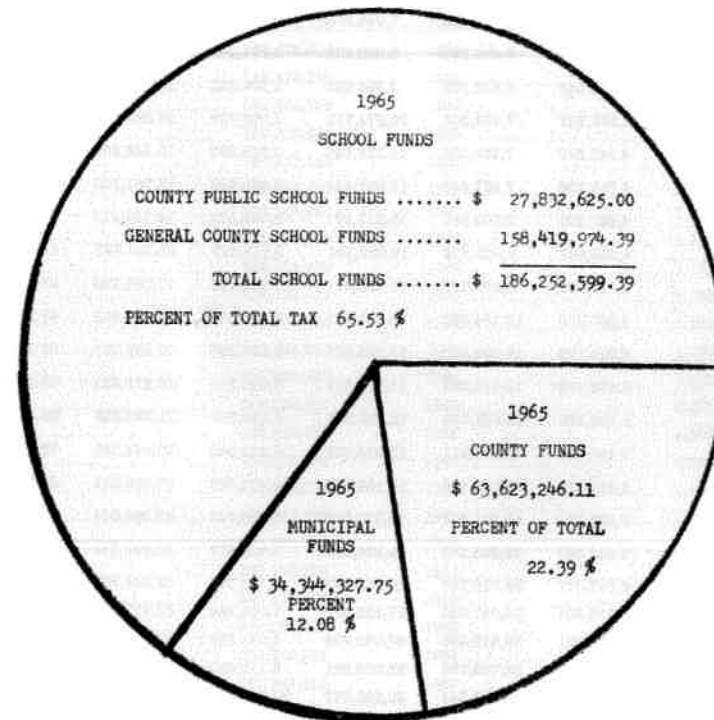
