

# Colorado COAL

### FACT SHEET

The total 2005 value of coal produced is estimated to be \$813 million.

### **EMPLOYMENT**

- Colorado has 1,991 coal miners: a nine percent increase from 2004.
- The average coal production is 9.1 tons per minerhour, one of the most efficient rates in the nation.


- Electricity generation in power plants

- Coal gasification


## **DISTRIBUTION** and CONSUMPTION

- 68 percent of Colorado's coal is shipped by rail to states such as Kentucky, Texas, Tennessee, Mississippi, Utah, and Illinois.
- 13 Colorado power plants consumed 18.76 million tons of coal in 2005, generating 37.3 million megawatt-hours of electricity. Most of this coal is from Colorado, but some is from Wyoming.

### **PRODUCTION**

- Colorado is ranked 7th in coal production in the U.S.
- Peabody Energy's Foidel Creek/Twentymile Mine in Routt County is the fourth largest underground coal mine in the U.S. Colorado coal production record of 9.37 million tons set in 2005.
- The spot price of Colorado's Uinta Basin low sulfur bituminous coal increased from \$17/ton to \$37/ton in the last two years.
- 37.8 million tons of coal were produced in Colorado in 2005.






### **COLORADO COAL QUALITY**



- Colorado coal is low in sulfur and ash content.
- Colorado's "clean coal" can be used at power plants without the added cost of washing.
- Colorado coal is also very low in mercury and arsenic.
- Western US coal contains less sulfur than eastern coal.
