"Colorado Revised Statute: 23-10-101 (b): 'The Denver campus of the University of Colorado shall be a comprehensive baccalaureate liberal arts and sciences institution with selective admission standards. The Denver campus shall provide selected professional programs and such graduate programs at the master's and doctoral level as will serve the needs of the Denver metropolitan area, emphasizing those professional programs not offered by other institutions of higher education.'"

"The University of Colorado at Denver is authorized to offer baccalaureate liberal arts and science programs, selected professional and other degree programs. It is also authorized to offer liberal arts and science master programs, selected master level professional and other degree programs. The university may offer doctoral degrees if they are 1) coordinated degree programs through the University of Colorado, 2) programs unique to the state or, 3) the programs moved to the campus by the Commission in March, 1986."

DEFINITION OF TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

Some of the tables and graphs included in this document use abbreviations or terms which may be unfamiliar. Following is a list of the most commonly used terms and related definitions.

FTE Student (FTES) - full-time equivalent student, calculated by dividing student credit hours by 30.

Fiscal Year FTES - includes summer, fall, and spring student credit hours divided by 30.

Term FTES - full-time equivalent student for a single semester, calculated by dividing student credit hours by 15.

Headcount Students - the number of individual students enrolled for a semester.

SCH - Student credit hours, derived by multiplying the number of students enrolled in a course by the course credit (3.0 credit hours x 30 students = 90 SCH).

FTEF - Full-time equivalent faculty.

SFR - Student faculty ratio (FTES divided by FTEF).

NRA - Non-resident alien.

HISTORY AND SUMMARY OF FACTS

History

- 1912 University of Colorado organizes Department of Correspondence and Extension in Denver; courses first offered.
- 1923 Regents of University of Colorado adopt policy to accept up to 90 hours of credit work earned in the Extension Division.
- 1953 Appointment of a Dean of the Extension Division.
- 1956 Regents purchase Tramway Building to house Extension Division.
- 1964 Regents change name of Denver Extension Center to the University of Colorado - Denver Center and place the administration of programs under the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of Faculties.
- 1972 Constitutional amendment allowing the University of Colorado to maintain and develop branches and to rename the Denver Center the University of Colorado at Denver.
- 1974 House Bill 1163 Statutory Recognition for Auraria.
Reorganization of the University of Colorado into a four-campus system.

Fine Arts, Music, and Theatre are no longer a part of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. They were transferred to the College of Arts and Media in FY 1997-98.

The School of Architecture and Planning changed its name to the College of Architecture and Planning in academic year 1993-94 to reflect the merger of the Graduate School of Architecture and Planning in Denver with the undergraduate College of Environmental Design in Boulder.

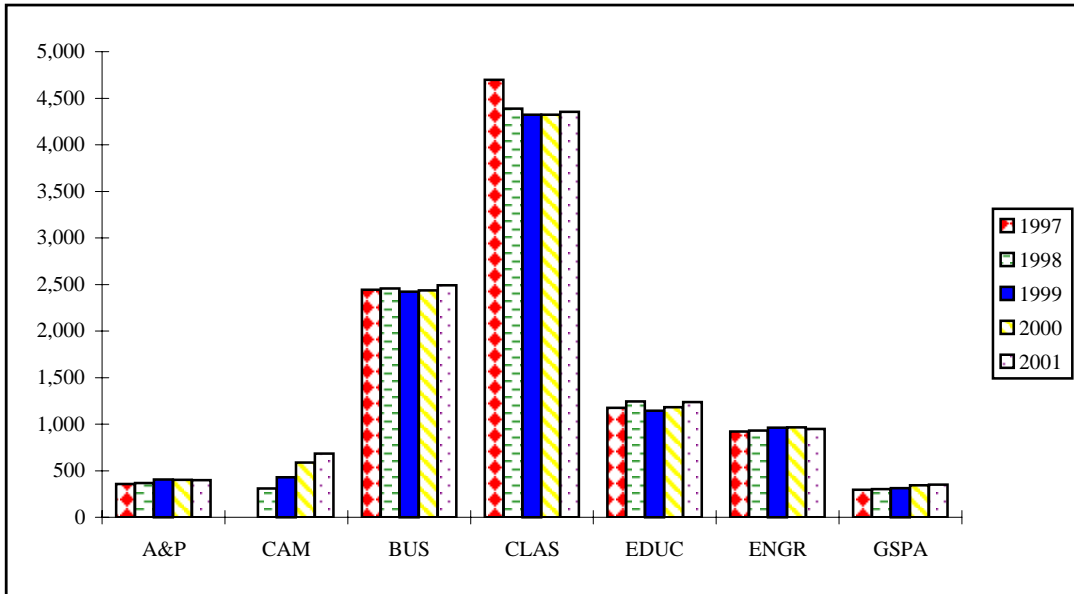

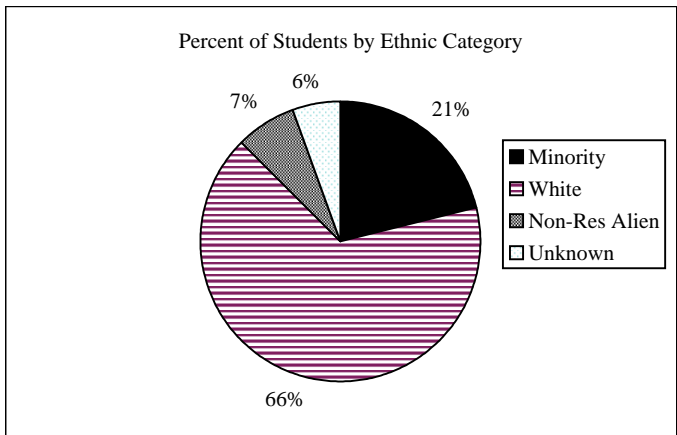
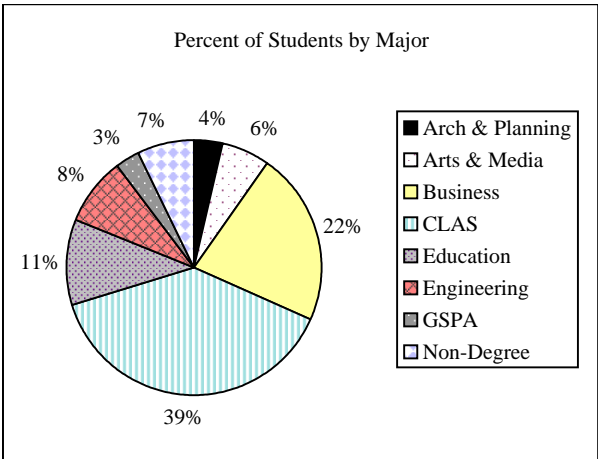

FALL 2001**



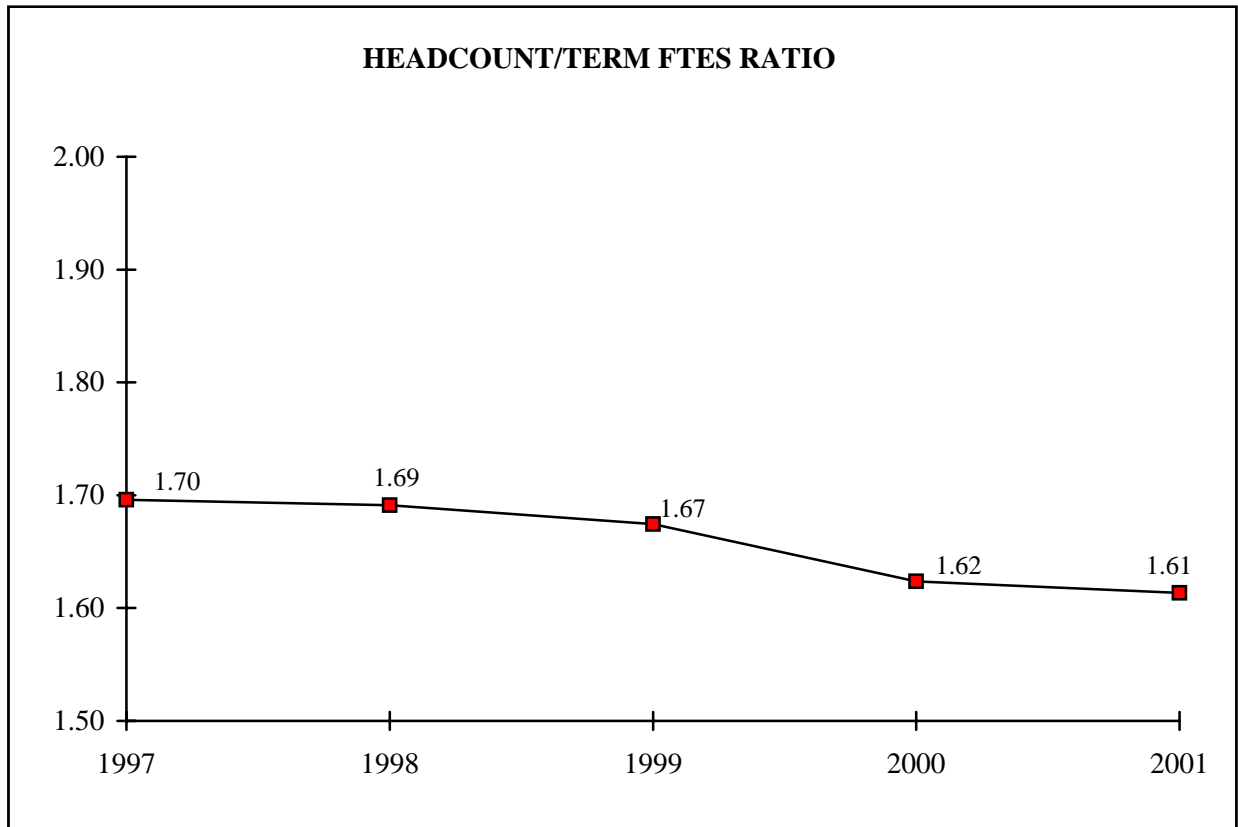

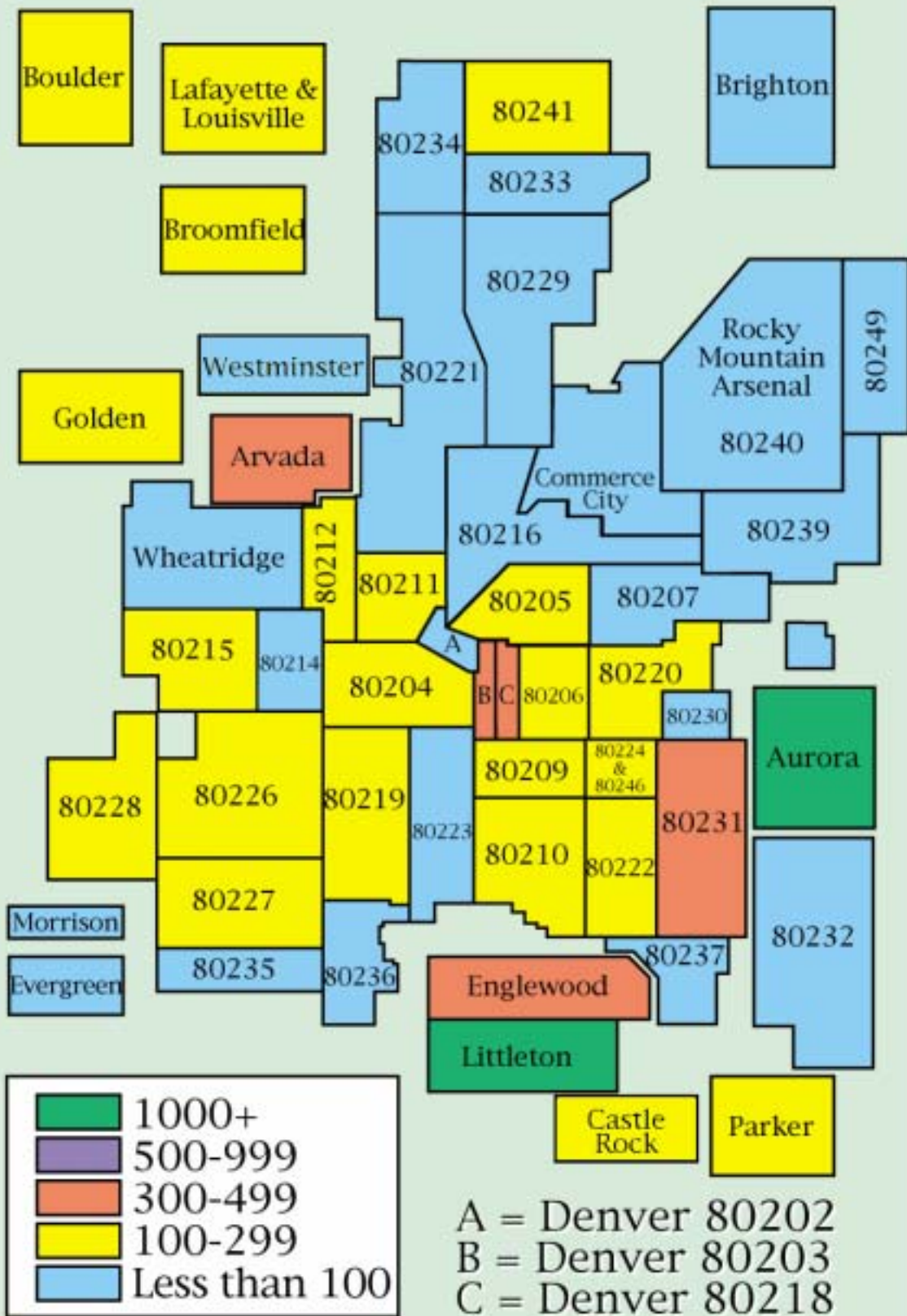

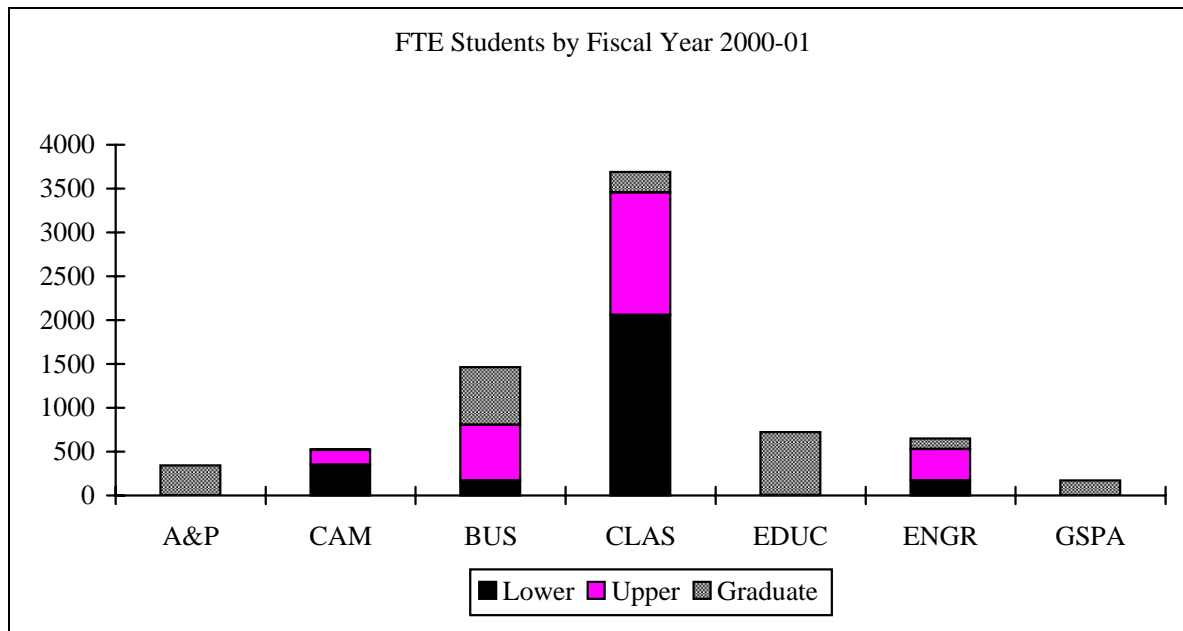

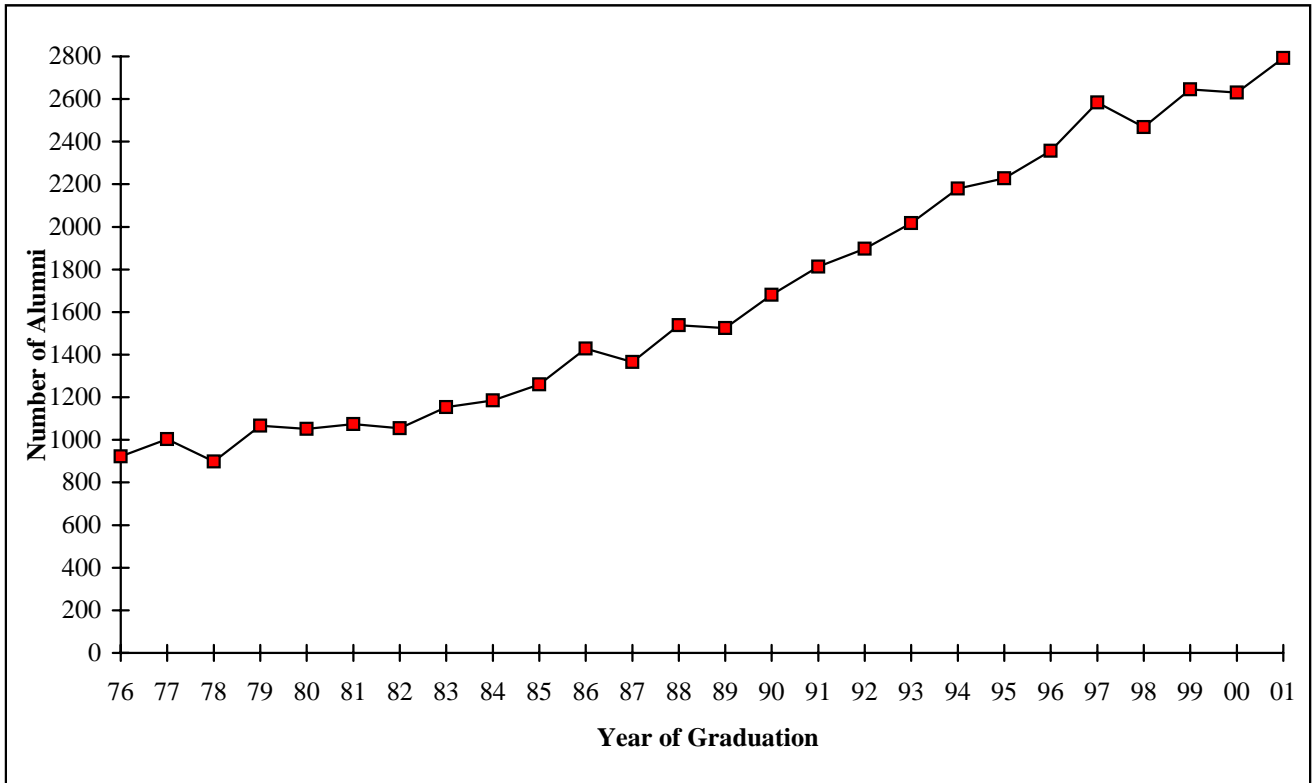

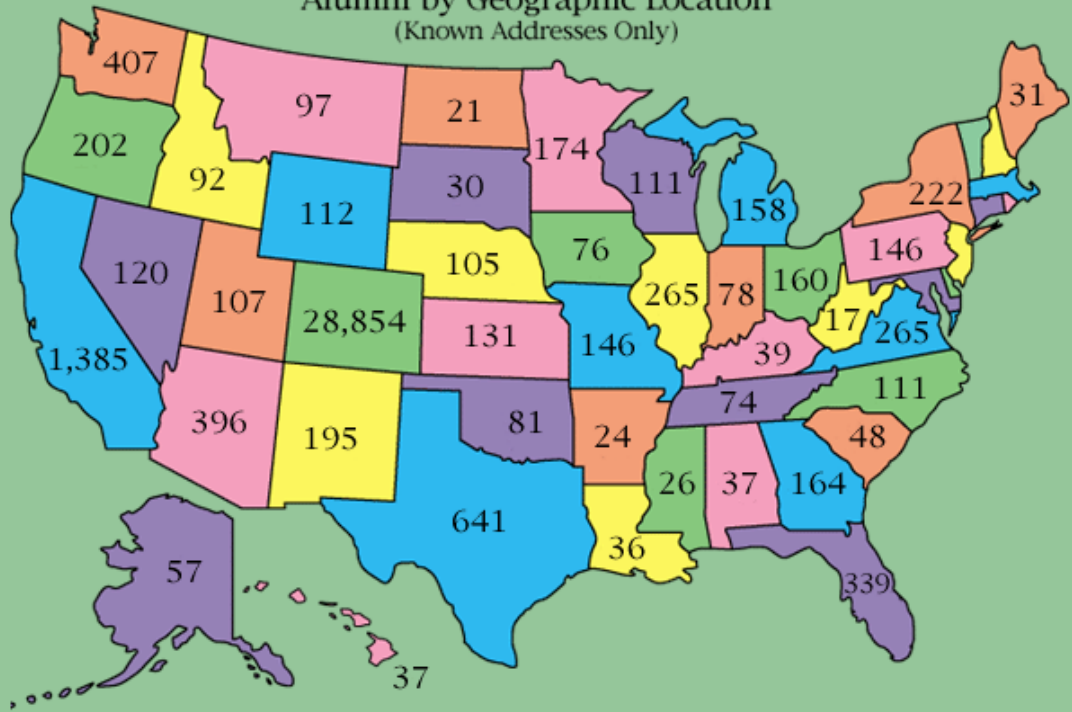

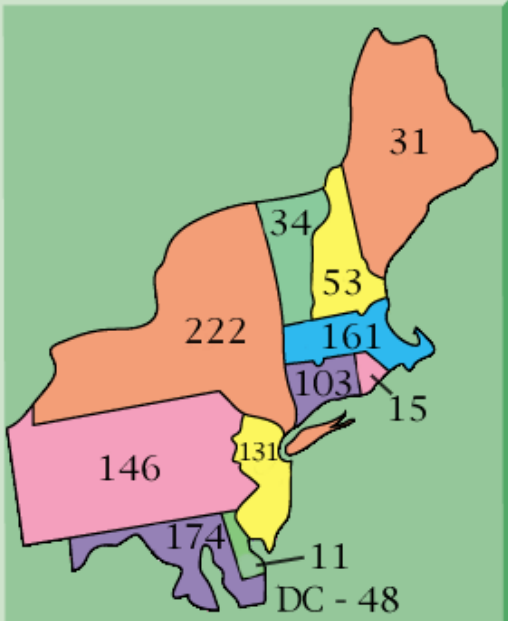

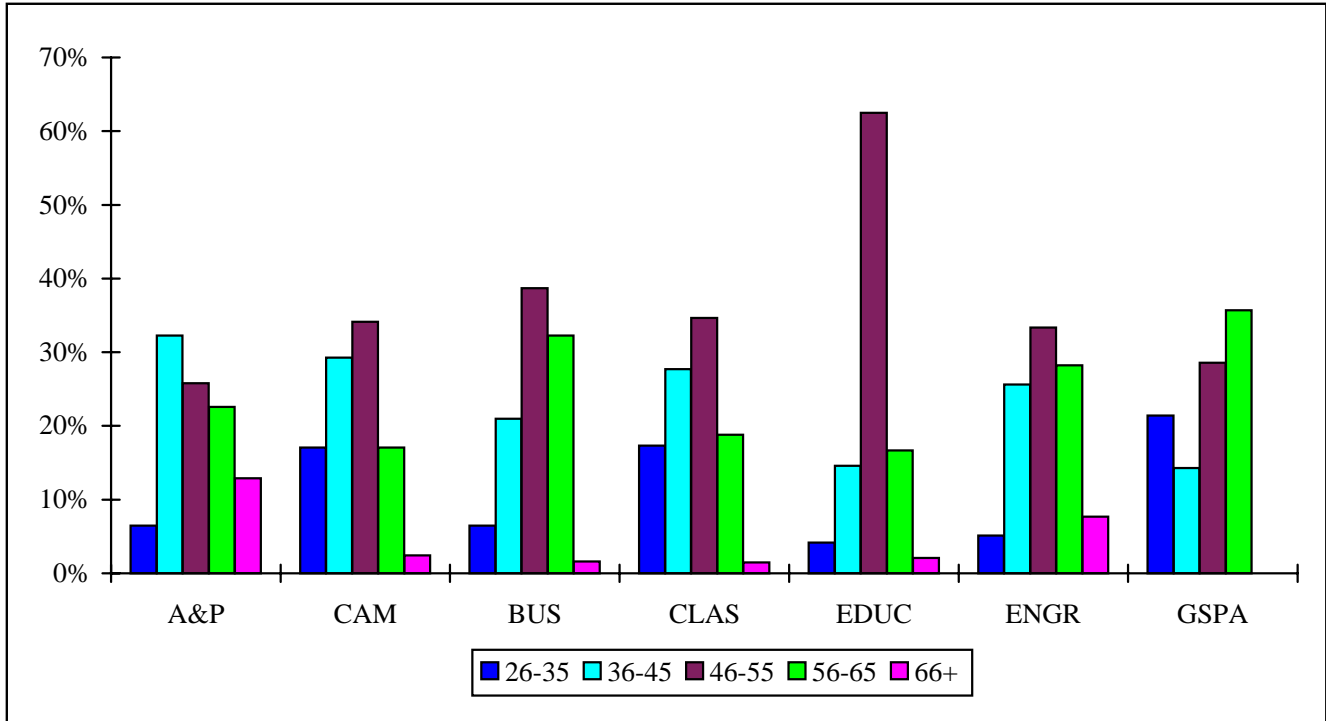

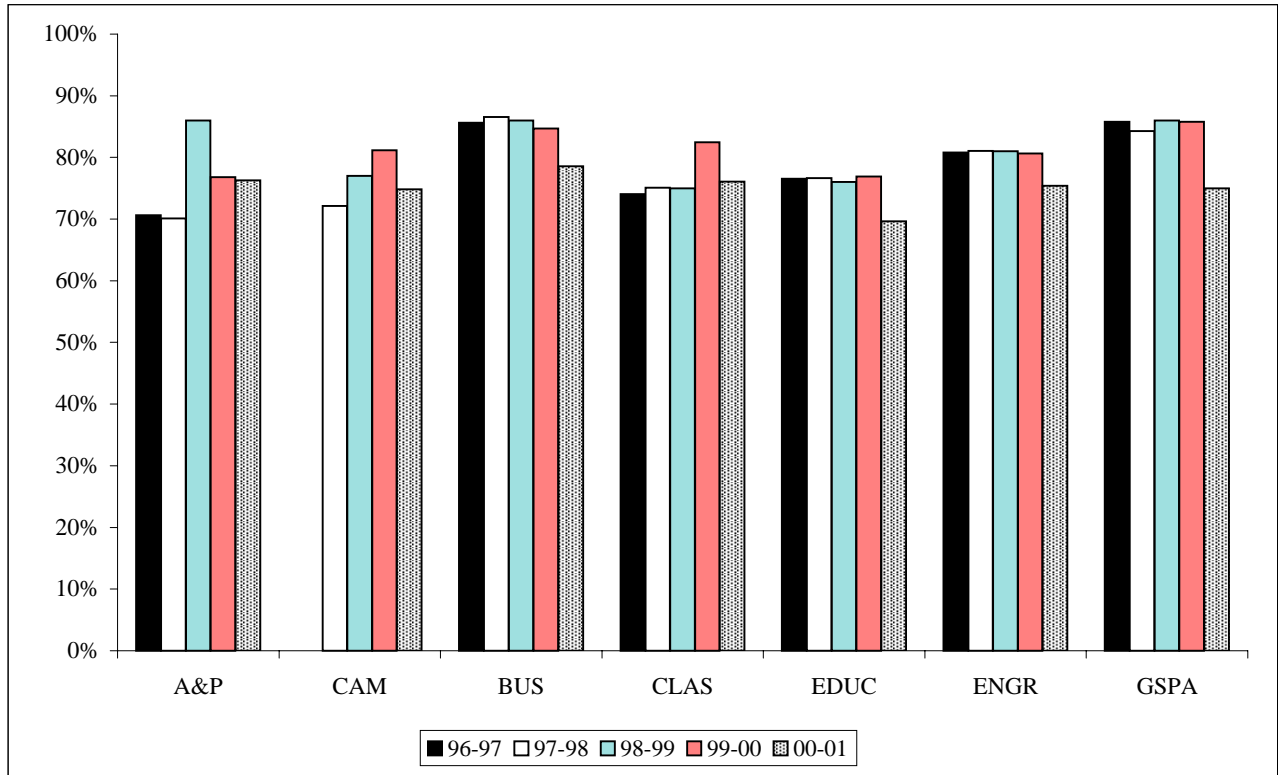

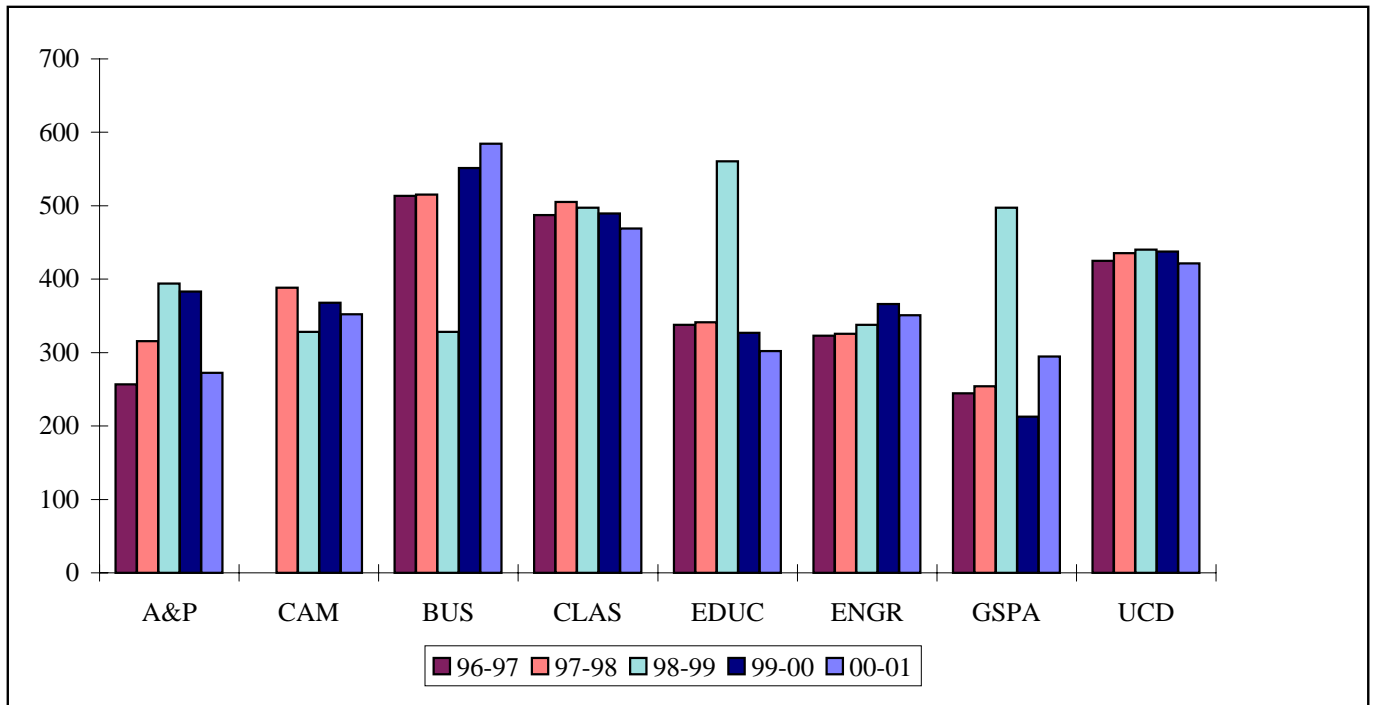

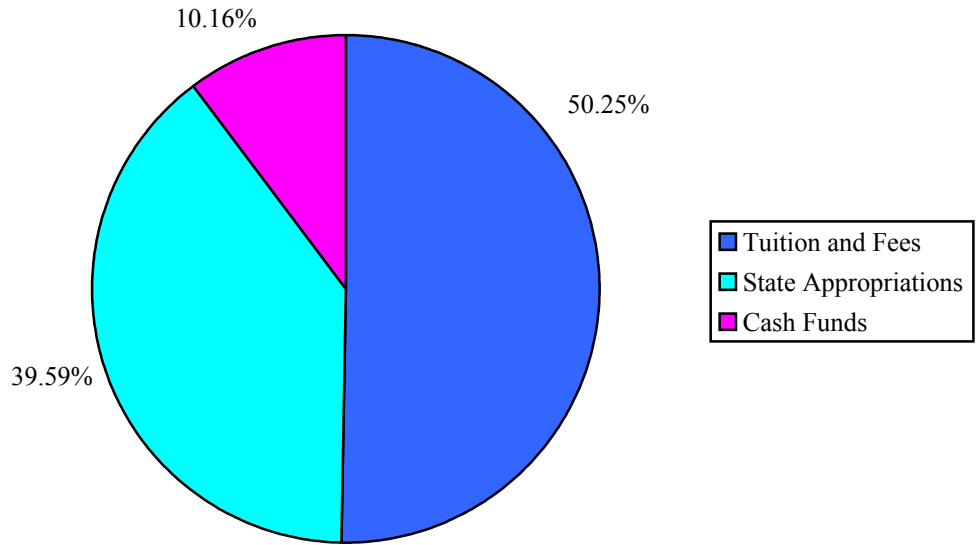

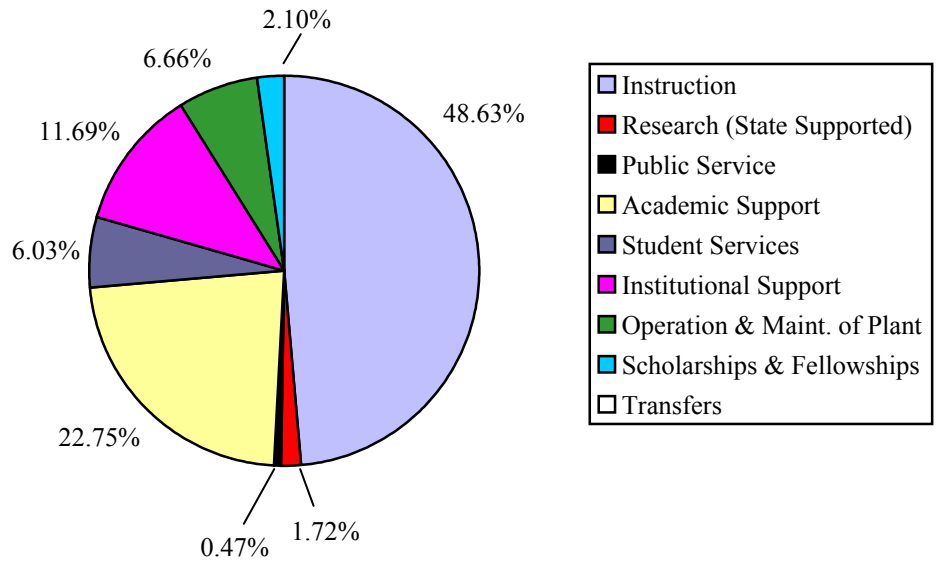

REVENUE FY 2000-01



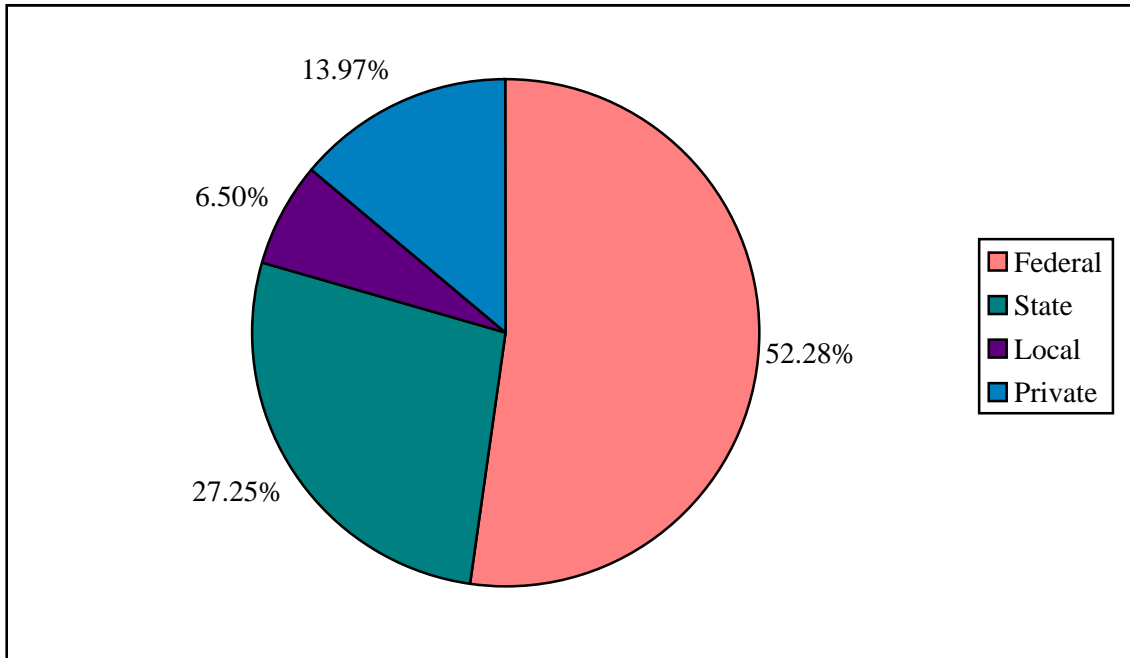
EXPENDITURES FY 2000-01

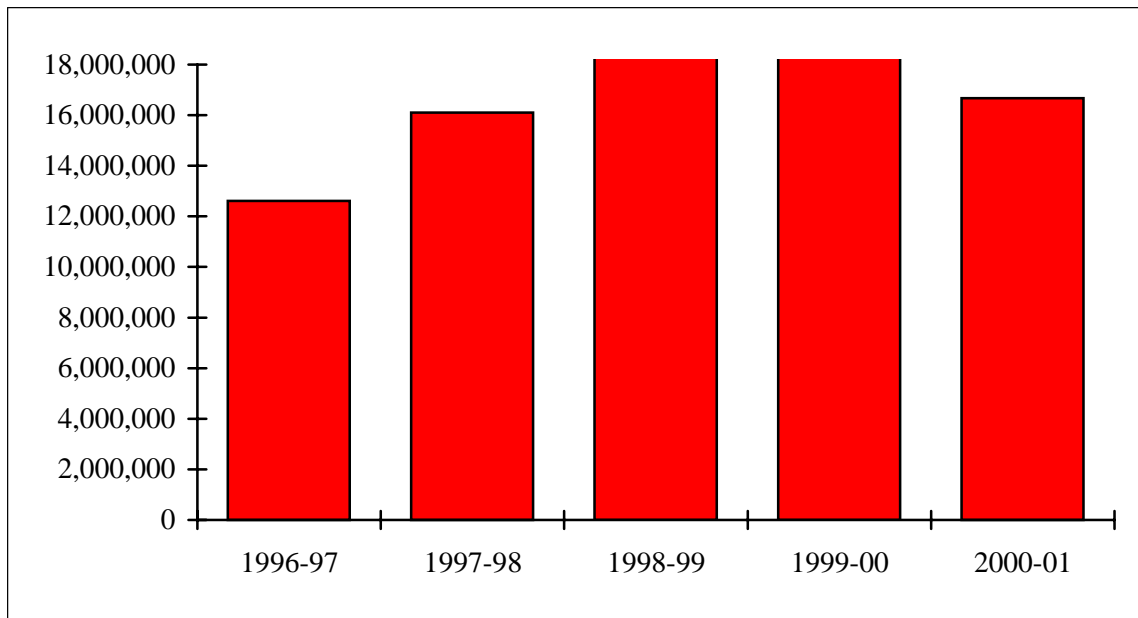
