Section I.
General Information

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO AT DENVER AND HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER STATEMENTS OF PURPOSE

The University of Colorado at Denver and Health Sciences Center is a new university composed of three University of Colorado campuses – Downtown Denver, Ninth and Colorado, and the Anschutz Medical Campus at Aurora. The University of Colorado Board of Regents created the new university on July 1, 2004, with the consolidation of the University of Colorado at Denver and the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. The new university's mission spans the scopes of its parts and its vision is to:

- Become the premier urban research university with nationally ranked programs of teaching, clinical care and community service throughout Colorado.
- Provide access to higher education for undergraduate, graduate, and professional students with increased multicultural diversity through recruitment and pipeline initiatives.
- Offer new interdisciplinary programs of education and research in the life sciences, professional programs and liberal arts.
- Become a more entrepreneurial university with two campuses in the Denver/Aurora metropolitan area and the state.
- Develop regional business and community partnerships that stimulate new programs and an improved economy.

DOWNTOWN DENVER CAMPUS STATEMENTS OF PURPOSE

MISSION, ROLE AND SCOPE STATEMENT

(SB 03-304 signed by Governor Owens June, 2003)

The Denver campus of the University of Colorado shall be an urban comprehensive undergraduate and graduate research university with selective admission standards. The Denver campus shall offer baccalaureate, masters, and a limited number of doctoral degree programs, emphasizing those that serve the needs of the Denver metropolitan area. The Denver campus has statewide authority to offer graduate programs in Public Administration and exclusive authority in Architecture and Planning.

HEALTH SCIENCES CAMPUS

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission statement of the Health Sciences Center (HSC) reflects the main purposes of the institution:

- the education of health professionals;
- the delivery of both health care and community service; and
- the advancement of knowledge through research in the health sciences.

LEGISLATIVE MISSION

The legislative mission for the HSC is mandated by the Constitution of Colorado. The Colorado Revised Statutes (C.R.S. 23-20-101) state that the HSC campus' role is to "be a specialized professional institution offering baccalaureate and graduate programs in health-related disciplines." This mission statement was created during the early history of the institution and, although reviewed by the state legislature and the Board of Regents, has not changed since that time.

DEFINITION OF TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS

Some of the tables and graphs included in this document use abbreviations or terms which may be unfamiliar. Following is a list of the most commonly used terms and related definitions.

FTE Student (FTES) - full-time equivalent student, calculated by dividing student credit hours by 30.

Fiscal Year FTES - includes summer, fall, and spring student credit hours divided by 30.

Term FTES - full-time equivalent student for a single semester, calculated by dividing student credit hours by 15.

Headcount Students - the number of individual students enrolled for a semester.

SCH - Student credit hours, derived by multiplying the number of students enrolled in a course by the course credit (e.g., 3.0 credit hours x 30 students = 90 SCH).

FTEF - Full-time equivalent faculty.

SFR - Student faculty ratio (FTES divided by FTEF).

NRA - Non-resident alien.

First Professional – Programs offering degrees in dentistry (DDS), physical therapy (DPT), medicine (MD), nursing (ND/DNP), or pharmacy (PharmD)


UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO AT DENVER & HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER HISTORY AND SUMMARY OF FACTS

History

- 1883 The Medical Department of the University of Colorado opened with two students and two senior faculty members.
- 1898 The School of Nursing was established.
- 1912 University of Colorado organizes Department of Correspondence and Extension in Denver; courses first offered.
- 1913 The School of Pharmacy became an independent school after it had been a department in the School of Medicine for two years.
- 1923 Regents of University of Colorado adopt policy to accept up to 90 hours of credit work earned in the Extension Division.
- 1925 The new medical center at Ninth Avenue near Colorado Blvd. was formally dedicated.
- 1953 Appointment of a Dean of the Extension Division.
- 1956 Regents purchase Tramway Building to house Extension Division.
- 1964 Regents change name of Denver Extension Center to the University of Colorado - Denver Center and place the administration of programs under the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of Faculties.
- 1965 The Medical Center had been greatly expanded to 47 acres including a new Colorado General Hospital and modern quarters for the Medical and Nursing Schools.
- 1972 Constitutional amendment allowing the University of Colorado to maintain and develop branches and to rename the Denver Center the University of Colorado at Denver.
- 1973 The School of Dentistry enrolled its first class.
- 1974 House Bill 1163 Statutory Recognition for Auraria.
Reorganization of the University of Colorado into a four-campus system.
- 1992 School of Pharmacy moved to Health Sciences Center from the Boulder campus.
- 1995 The federal government conveyed 217 acres of the Fitzsimons site in Aurora, Colorado, to the University of Colorado to build a 21st century health sciences center from the ground up. The first phase of transition from the current campus at Ninth Avenue and Colorado Boulevard in Denver to the Fitzsimons will be completed in 2010.
- 2000 The Anschutz Outpatient Pavilion, the Anschutz Cancer Pavilion, and the Building 500 renovation for support space were finished.
- 2001 The Preservation and Access Service Center for Colorado Academic Libraries – Library archive facility, the Rocky Mountain Lions Eye Institute, and the Perinatal Research Center Expansion were completed.
- 2002 The Nighthorse Campbell Native Health Building was dedicated.
- 2004 The Anschutz Inpatient Pavilion opened. The Research Complex I was completed. Included in the Research Complex I facilities are wet and dry research laboratories, core laboratories, lab support space (including space for linear equipment), researcher and program offices, conference rooms, a central vivarium, auditoria, and building support space.
- 2004 The University of Colorado at Denver and the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center joined into a single major urban research university. The consolidated institution boasts some 27,070 students and more than 100 degree programs. The new entity operates on a budget of \$866 million and attracts more than \$300 million a year in research grants and contracts. Consequently, renamed as the University of Colorado at Denver and Health Sciences Center.
- 2005 The Barbara Davis Center for Childhood Diabetes, the largest diabetes and endocrine care research and training program in Colorado, transitioned into a new facility at Fitzsimons.
- 2006 In recognition of a series of gifts totaling more than \$91 million by The Anschutz Foundation, the University of Colorado system announced that it's University of Colorado at Denver and Health Sciences Center's Aurora campus will be known as the Anschutz Medical Campus.








Student Headcount by County, Fall 2006


















REVENUE UCDHSC FY 2005-06






Downtown Denver Campus FY 2006 Actual Expenditures


Downtown Denver Campus Sources of Revenue

Health Sciences Center FY 2006 Actual Expenditures


