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Revisor of Statutes:

Pursuant to §39-22-1001(8)(b), C.R.S., the Department of Revenue hereby advises the Revisor of Statutes that the 2017 Colorado Individual Income Tax Return shall provide no more than 20 lines for voluntary contributions to the following charitable organizations. 16. Make-A-Wish Foundation of Colorado Fund
17. Unwanted Horse Fund

Two new Checkoff Colorado funds will be added to the 2017 Individual Income Tax Return: Urban Peak Fund, and Family Caregiver Support Fund.
