2009 YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEY **COLORADO & U.S. COMPARISON**

The Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS) monitors priority health-risk behaviors and the prevalence of obesity and asthma among youth and young adults. The YRBSS includes a national school-based survey conducted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and state, territorial, tribal, and district surveys conducted by state, territorial, and local education and health agencies and tribal governments.

• Did not eat green salad (during the seven days before the survey).

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY



Where Colorado Teens are HEALTHIER

• Did not participate in at least 60 minutes of physical activity on any day (doing any kind of physical activity that increased their heart rate and made them breathe hard some of the time during the seven days before the survey).

• Physically active five of past seven days (doing any kind of moderate physical activity that increased their heart rate and made them breathe hard some of the time).

• Physically active on seven of the last seven days (doing any kind of heavy physical activity that increased their heart rate and made them breathe hard some of the time).
