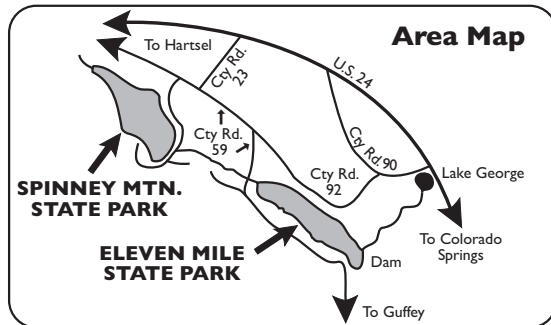
First Aid

In an emergency, contact a park ranger or call 911. Park rangers are trained in emergency first aid procedures.

Park Office/Camper Services

The Park Office is located in the camper services building near Rocky Ridge Campground on Park County Road 92. Also available at the camper services building are shower and laundry facilities, flush toilets and a public telephone.

Eleven Mile State Park is in South Park – an expansive high-altitude grassland region of central Colorado. The park is bordered on two sides by the Pike National Forest. The surrounding mountains, including Pikes Peak, the Tarryall Range and the snowy peaks of the Continental Divide, complement Eleven Mile’s own scenic reservoir, short grasses and rocky outcroppings.

This remarkable setting is home to tremendous recreational opportunities. Eleven Mile’s waters have surrendered some of the largest fish ever taken in Colorado. The reservoir’s boaters, particularly sailors, are challenged by the tricky winds and fast-rising storms that occasionally sweep the area.

Eleven Mile’s elevation of 8,600 feet makes for a wide range of temperatures in any season, so park visitors should dress accordingly. Visitors should also be prepared to protect themselves against sunburn at this altitude.

Colorado State Parks manages Eleven Mile’s 3,400 surface-acre reservoir and 4,000 land acres under a lease from the Denver Water Board. The reservoir has been an important water storage facility for the city of Denver since the dam was completed in 1932.

Passes & Permits

All vehicles entering the park are required to display a current Colorado State Parks Pass. A Daily Pass is valid for the day purchased until noon the following day. A Yearly Pass is valid at any state park for 12 months from date of purchase. For yearly passholders with an additional vehicle, a multiple pass is available for a reduced fee. Daily passes are available at main park entrances and self service dispensers.

Colorado’s senior citizens 64 and older may obtain an Aspen Leaf Annual Pass, available at a discounted rate, at the park office.

Colorado disabled veterans displaying Colorado Disabled Veteran (DV) license plates are admitted free without a pass.

Fishing

Rainbow, brown and cutthroat trout, kokanee salmon, northern pike and carp are found in the reservoir. Fishing is prohibited in the restricted area near the dam, but it is permitted everywhere else. Bow fishing for carp is permitted year-round. Please check the current Colorado Fishing Regulation brochure for special regulations, season dates or bag limits that may apply.

Camping

Eleven Mile’s 349 campsites can accommodate tents, pick-up campers, trailers and motor homes. A camping permit is required for all vehicles parked overnight. Only one camping unit with a single family or a maximum of six people is permitted per site. Electrical hookups are available in Rocky Ridge Campground. No more than two motor vehicles are allowed at any site.

Quiet hours are enforced from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

In the backcountry area of the park, near the east end of the reservoir, there are 25 walk-in or boat-in campsites.

Dump Stations

Holding tank dump stations are located near the North Shore and Witcher’s Cove entrances. Please use these facilities. It is illegal to dump waste anywhere else. A valid vehicle pass and a valid camping permit are required to dump tanks.

Wildlife & Hunting

Several species of waterfowl are abundant at the reservoir. Pronghorn antelope, elk, deer, bear, coyote, mountain lion, bobcat and many varieties of small mammals frequent the park and surrounding area.

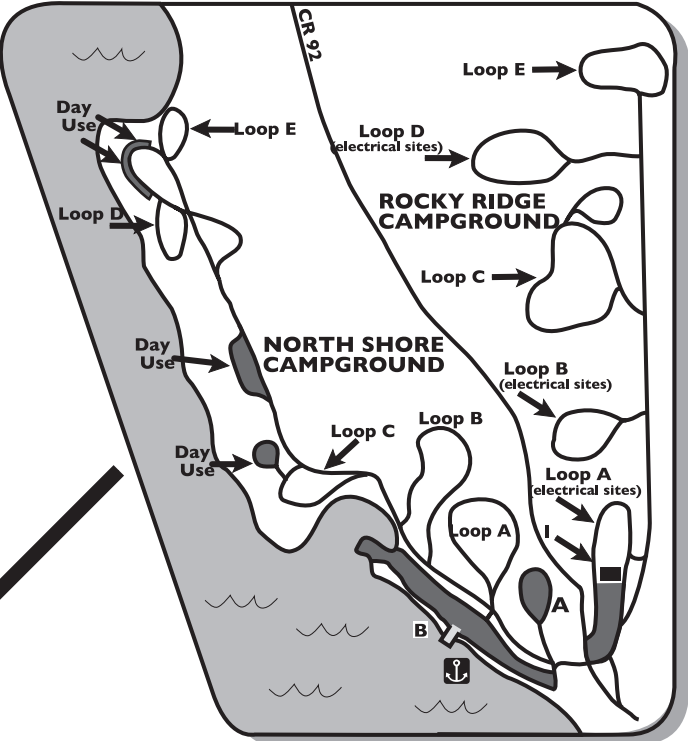
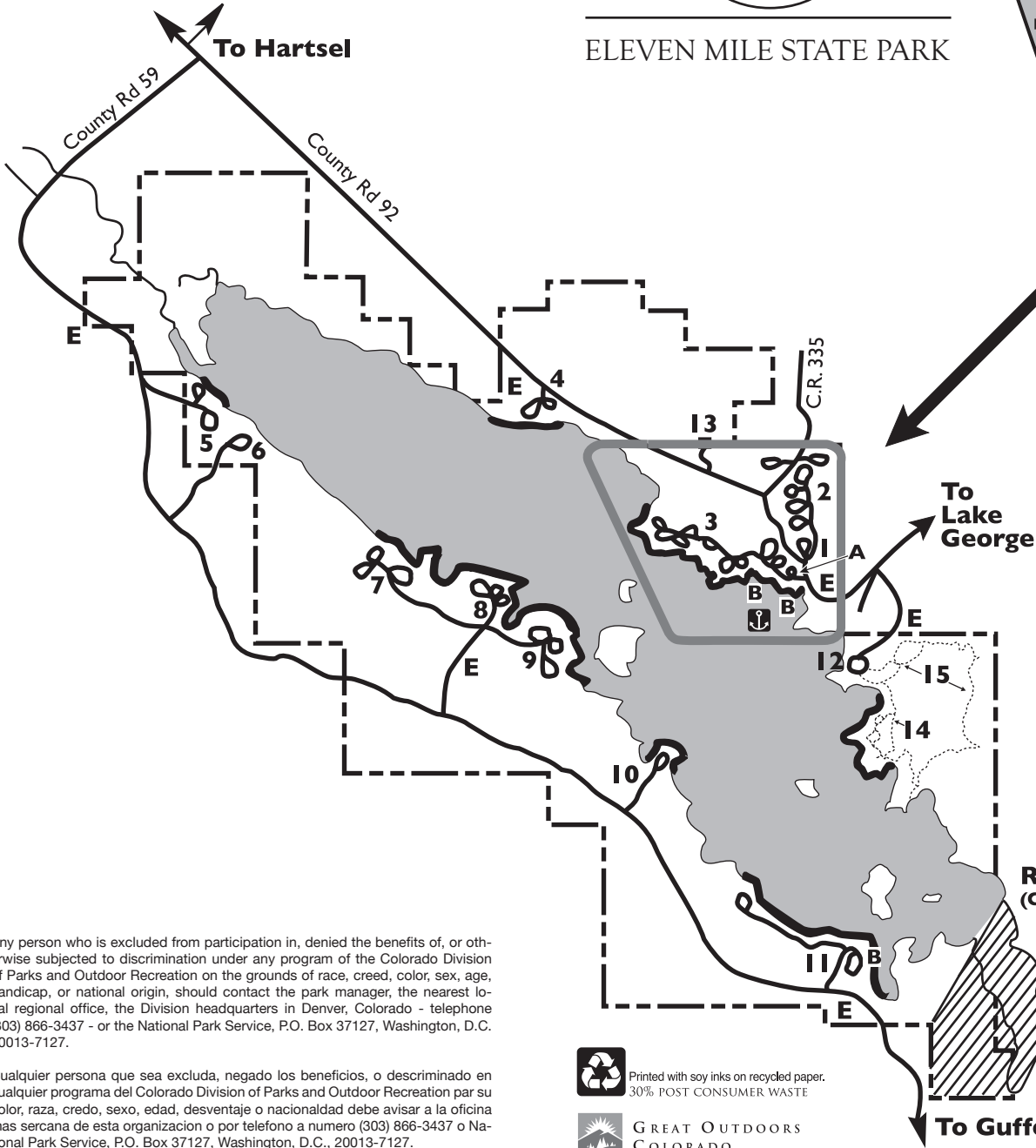
Hunting is permitted in specific portions of the park during legal seasons. Maps of hunting areas are available online or at the park office. The park supports many species of ducks as they migrate south each fall.

Accessibility

Winter Recreation

Winter activities include ice fishing, ice boating, ice skating and cross-country skiing. Snowmobiles and off-highway vehicles are prohibited unless a special activity permit is issued to a permanently disabled fishermen by the park staff.

Boating

Boaters must observe all Colorado boating statutes and regulations. Regulation brochures are available at the Park Office and are posted at self-serve stations.

1. All vessels must be inspected for aquatic invasive species prior to launching.
2. The reservoir is closed to boating from 1/2 hour after sunset until 1/2 hour before sunrise.
3. Water-contact sports such as swimming, water-skiing, wading and scuba diving are prohibited. Wind surfing is permitted with a full wetsuit.
4. Boat docks are for loading and unloading only. Mooring at or fishing from the docks is prohibited. A five-minute use limit is enforced.
5. All islands and the restricted area at the southeast end of the reservoir are closed to all public use.

CAUTION: Sudden storms with strong winds and high waves can develop quickly at Eleven Mile. Underwater hazards are frequently found in the reservoir and not all are marked. Boaters should be especially careful when within 150 feet of any shoreline.

Regulations

- Eleven Mile State Park requests that you:
1. Display a valid parks pass on each motor vehicle entering the park.
 2. Keep vehicles on established roads and parking areas.
 3. Camp only in established camping sites. A camping permit is required in addition to the parks pass.
 4. Build fires only in grills at campsites.
 5. Keep pets on a leash no longer than six feet.
 6. Dispose of all trash, garbage, fish entrails, etc. in provided receptacles.
 7. Only 3.2% alcoholic beverages are allowed.
