

Colorado Department of Human Services, Division of Youth Corrections Fact Sheet

The Division of Youth Corrections (DYC) provides residential and non-residential services to juveniles including detention, commitment and parole.

DYC operates 10 secure facilities that serve youth between the ages of 10 and 21, who are pre-adjudicated (waiting to go to court), sentenced, or committed to youth services for treatment. For pre-adjudicated youth, DYC also provides services to youth at risk of further progressing into the juvenile justice system. In addition to residential programming, DYC administers juvenile parole services.

State Operated Detention Facilities

The Division of Youth Corrections is responsible for both State operated detention and for privately contracted staff-secure detention. Four of the State operated facilities serve only detention youth; the Gilliam Youth Services Center, Denver; the Adams Youth Services Center, Brighton; the Pueblo Youth Services Center, Pueblo; and the Marvin W. Foote Youth Services Center, Englewood.

Four secure State operated facilities are multi-purpose, serving youth in detention as well as committed youth. These four facilities include Platte Valley Youth Services Center, Greeley; Grand Mesa Youth Services Center, Grand Junction; Spring Creek Youth Services Center, Colorado Springs; and Mount View Youth Services Center, Denver.

State Operated Secure Treatment Programs

Two of the Division of Youth Corrections secure facilities, Lookout Mountain Youth Services Center, Golden; and Zeb Pike Youth Services Center, Colorado Springs, only serve committed youth. These programs are designed to treat the highest risk, highest need committed males.
