Incident and Escape Report Calendar Years 2006 and 2007



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Introduction

The Colorado Department of Corrections has established this report for the purpose of reporting incidents and escapes that occur in and from the Colorado Department of Corrections (CDOC) state owned and operated facilities and contract facilities, including community corrections centers.

Incident reporting (Administrative Regulation 100-07) is a major factor in establishing and measuring safety in facilities. The policy of CDOC is to require timely communication of reportable incidents to appropriate management staff the Office of the Governor, and the general public as appropriate. Incident reports create documentation of violations that can be evaluated so further incidents can be deterred or prevented. This report is a summary and analysis of all incident reports that were transmitted through the Department of Corrections Information System (DCIS) reporting system.

Additional information is provided regarding convictions under the Code of Penal Discipline (COPD) (Administrative Regulation 150-01), sexual violence and escape incidents. The COPD is a management tool used to regulate the conduct of inmates and to improve the safety within a facility. Escape incidents are tracked to ensure the safety of the general public. Inconsistencies in reporting policies and procedures across the facilities were identified in 2001, and standard department incident reporting was ceased until new standards were implemented in late 2004. The Office of Planning and Analysis began tracking and reporting major incidents in January 2005, although final policy changes did not become effective until February 2005. Therefore 2005 reportable incidents may be understated as training and education of the new policies and practices took several months. The Reportable Incident System (CDOC official reporting system) will be used by the Office of Planning and Analysis from this point forward.

Reporting

The administrative head or the on-call duty officer is responsible for making the telephone notification of incidents. If the incident occurs during normal business hours, telephone reporting shall be immediately followed by a data entry terminal incident report into DCIS using the format of AR 100-7, attachment B. If the incident occurs during non-business hours, the data entry terminal incident report shall be made no later than 10:00 a.m. the next business day. Sexual violence incidents reported directly to the Inspector General's office are included in the sexual violence section. All other incidents reported directly to the Inspector General's office for security and confidentiality concerns are not included unless they were also reported via DCIS. The database categorizes incidents into eighteen separate areas; six areas are evaluated and analyzed in this report. The following are the six areas presented in this report:

- **Incidents of Violence** are incidents of inmate assault on staff, inmate assaults on inmates and fighting.

- **Self-inflicted Injury** incidents are defined as the intentional harming of one's self. Self-harming ideation or threats are not included. Only incidents involving or resulting in injury are reported.
- **Inmate Death** include all death categories; homicide, suicide, execution, accidental, natural and unknown. Information obtained from inspector generals office medical personnel and coroner reports are used to determine cause of death.
- **Sexual Violence Incidents** are incidents of rape, sexual misconduct and sexual harassment.
- **Escapes** are defined as an act whereby an offender, without proper authority, leaves the confines of the facility or fails to return.
- **COPD Convictions** consist of a compilation of Code of Penal Discipline hearing results.

Incidents of Violence & Self-Inflicted Injury

Table 1 summarizes reportable incidents for calendar years 2006 through 2007. All incidents involved one or more inmates incarcerated within the jurisdiction of CDOC. In calendar year 2006, a total of 1,698 incidents were reported. Fighting was the most common incident reported (34.3% of total incidents). In calendar year 2007, a total of 1,586 incidents were reported. Fighting was the most common incident reported (36.3% of total incidents).

In calendar year 2006 the number of incidents per month averaged 141 incidents. The number of incidents per month ranged from 125 in February to a high of 159 in July. In calendar year 2007 the number of incidents per month averaged 132 incidents. The number of incidents per month ranged from 106 in June to a high of 164 in July.

In calendar year 2006, 804 incidents (47.4% of the 1,698 total incidents) occurred on the afternoon shift between 3:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. followed closely by 736 (43.3%) day shift, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.. 158 (9.3%) occurred during the night shift. In calendar year 2007, 723 incidents (45.6% of the 1,585 incidents) occurred on the day shift, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. followed closely by 702 (44.3%) afternoon shift between 3:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. 160 (10.1%) occurred during the night shift.

Rate of Incidence

The rate of incidence is a measure that controls for the population size of the facility, using the facility average daily population.

Methods of Aggression

In calendar year 2006 out of the 1,698 incidents that were reported, 1,232 involved some form of object or weapon. In calendar year 2007 out of the 1,585 incidents that were reported, 1,306 involved some form of object or weapon. The two incident types of inmate deaths and inmate sexual assaults on inmates are not included as they are covered in more detail in later sections. The methods of aggression were divided into six types as defined below.

Type	Definition
Body	Physical body contact including fists, feet, headbutt, biting, pulling away.
Body fluid	Fluid contact including blood, urine, saliva, feces.
Offensive substance	Substance that is not body related or elements that are not body related including food, drugs, chemicals, fire, and electricity.
Sharp object	Sharp pointed object including razor, knife, glass, pen, or pencil.
Solid object	Any object used for harm including board, tool, restraint, weight, rock, wall, door, and mattress. Any object used for strangulation such as sheets, clothing, plastic, or rope.
Lethal weapon	Any weapon that was created for deadly force, specifically firearms.

In calendar year 2006, the reportable incident category involving the highest number of objects or weapons was fighting (429 fights) with body as the weapon (417 incidents) as shown in Table 7. Self-inflicted injury (319 incidents) was the second highest category with 180 sharp objects as the weapon.

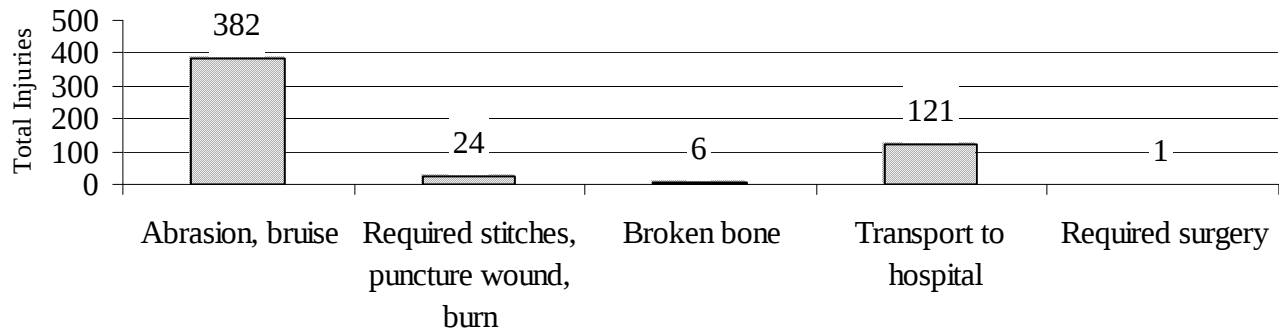

In calendar year 2007, the reportable incident category involving the highest number of objects or weapons was fighting (522 fights) with body as the weapon (510 incidents) as shown in Table 7. Assault on inmate (300 incidents) was the second highest category with 241 body as the weapon.

Incidents Resulting in Injury

In calendar year 2006 of the 1,232 incidents that involve a weapon, 534 resulted in injury to staff or inmates. Abrasions and bruises accounted for 71.5% of all injuries.

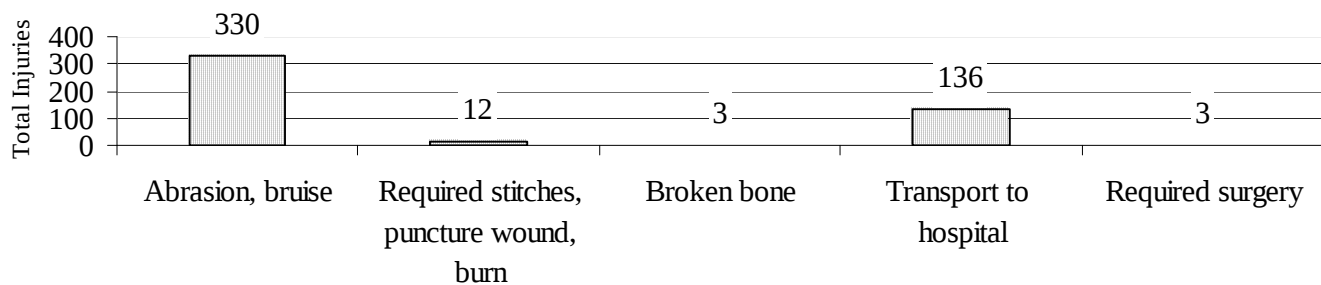

Most of the injuries (52.7%) involved the use of the body as an object or weapon. Of the 534 incidents, only 121 (22.7%) required transport to the hospital and one Assault on inmate incident resulted in surgery.

In calendar year 2007, of the 1,306 incidents that involve a weapon, 484 resulted in injury to staff or inmates. Abrasions and bruises accounted for 68.2% of all injuries.

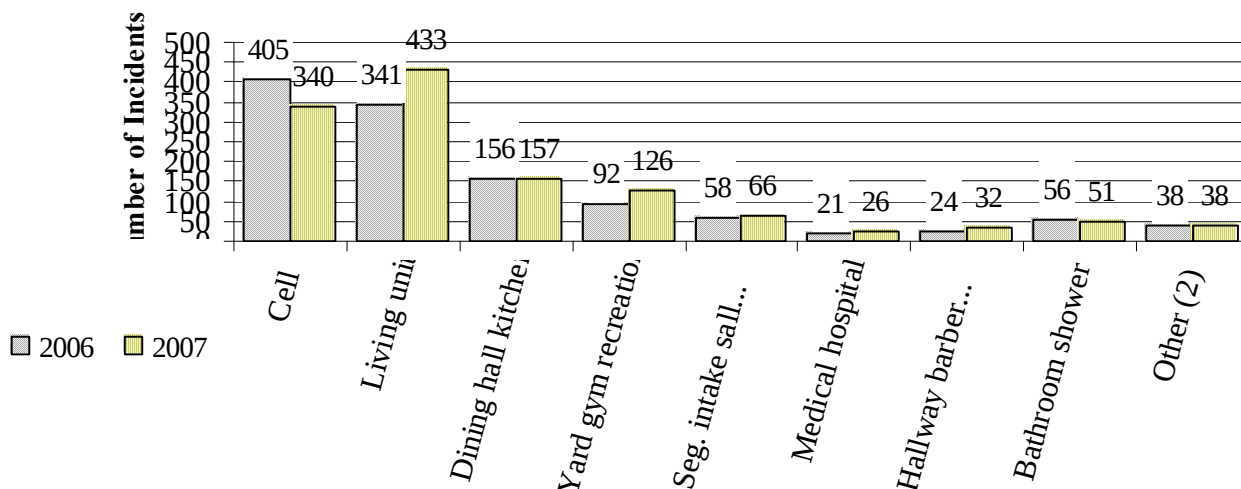

Most of the injuries (52.3%) involved the use of the body as an object or weapon. Of the 484 injury incidents, only 136 (28.1%) required transport to the hospital; three incidents resulted in surgery (1-assault on staff, 1-assault on inmate and 1-self-injury).

Location

In calendar year 2006, a total of 1,191 (70.1%) incidents reported a location of where the incident occurred. The highest number of incidents (34.0%) occurred in the cell. Assaults on inmates and fighting occurred most often in the living unit. Self-injury incidents occurred most often in the cell. In calendar year 2007, a total of 1,269 (80.1%) incidents reported a location of where the incident occurred. The highest number of incidents (34.1%) occurred in the living unit. Assaults on inmates and fighting occurred most often in the living unit. Self-injury incidents occurred most often in the cell.

Calendar Years 2006 and 2007



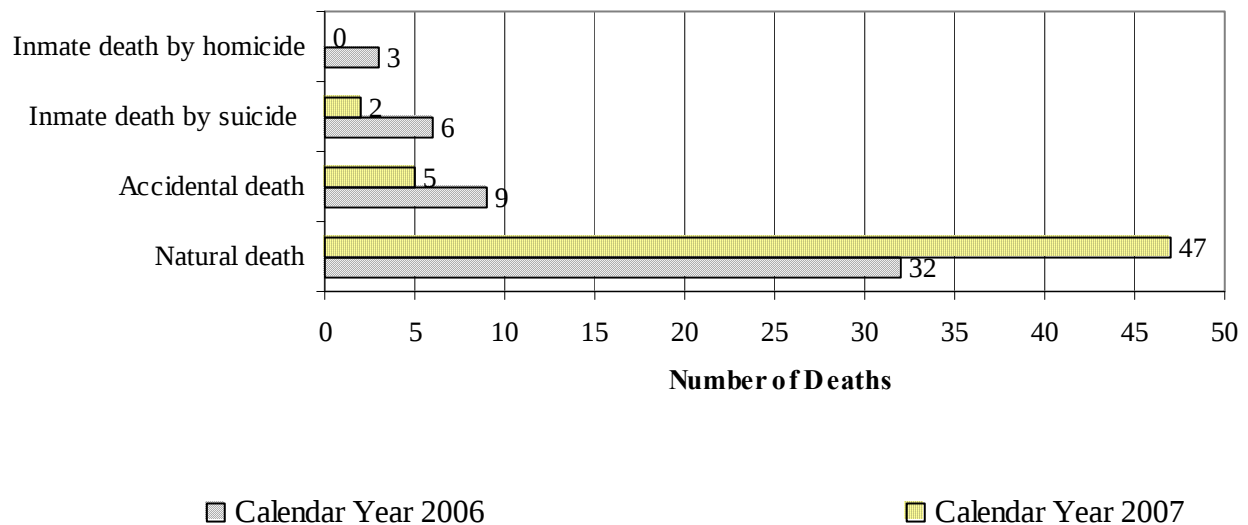

Inmate Death

Inmate deaths are reported in three categories: homicide, suicide, accidental and natural death. There were no unknown causes in 2006 or 2007. Table 13 shows total deaths for each category for 2006 and 2007.

Death by Homicide

Three homicides occurred in calendar year 2006: two offenders were in a community transition placement, one at Sterling Correctional Facility. Of the two community placements one was stabbed by his girlfriend at his residence, the other was shot at a house by another person. The DOC facility homicide victim died 22 days after an assault in the yard. No homicides occurred in calendar year 2007.

Death by Suicide

Six suicides occurred in calendar year 2006: three were fugitives from community placement at the time of their death. Of the six, four offenders die of asphyxia by hanging themselves; one in a DOC facility cell, two in county jail cell, and one offender hung himself in a parking lot while in the community. The remaining two offenders shot themselves during police involved incidents while in the community. Two suicides occurred in calendar year 2007; both died of asphyxia by hanging in their cell.

Death by Accident

Nine accidental deaths occurred in calendar year 2006. Seven accidental drug overdoses: five were community placement at the time of their death, one DOC facility and one jail backlog (county jail).

Of the two remaining deaths one DOC facility death due to accidental strangulation, one community placement offender died in a work related accidental electrocution. Five accidental deaths occurred in calendar year 2007. Four accidental drug overdoses (all four were from community placement; two were fugitives at the time of their death). The remaining accidental death was in community placement and died as the result of an automobile vs. bicycle accident.

Death by Natural Causes

Colorado Territorial Correctional Facility (CTCF) houses special programs for the terminally ill inmates, geriatric inmates, and extended care for the medically restricted inmates. For 2006, 31.3% (10) of natural deaths were at CTCF, where special programs exist such as hospice and long-term care to the geriatric offender. In 2007, 25.5% (12) natural deaths were at CTCF.

The Denver Reception and Diagnostic Center (DRDC) had 21.9% (7) of all natural deaths for calendar year 2006. DRDC offers to the Department of Corrections general medical care and a complete infirmary. In 2007, 25.5% (12) natural deaths were at DRDC.

Sexual Violence Incidents

This section covers known incidents of sexual violence that occurred in calendar year 2006 and calendar year 2007.

The categories and quantities of sexual violence in this section do not reflect the information reported under the federal reporting requirements for incidents of sexual violence through the Bureau of Justice Statistics. The federal requirements are limited to only those incidents that at least one participant appears unwilling and must be categorized according to their definitions for inmate with inmate activities. However, these categories were incorporated into the DCIS reporting system in February 2006 and the department's policy AR 100-07 "Reportable Incidents".

Several sources were utilized in conducting this research as follows:

- Reportable incidents
- Code of Penal Discipline (COPD) charges and/or convictions for:
 - o Class I 09 Rape
 - o Class II 06.5 Sexual Abuse
 - o Class II 24.5 Sexual Harassment
- Inspector General's Office (IGO) database – Information captured for criminal investigative purposes was provided to the Office of Planning and Analysis.
- Additional sources:
 - o electronic information from the Department of Corrections Information System (DCIS), including the incident tracking system.
 - o internal facility incident reports
 - o officer reports
 - o intelligence investigative reports
 - o offender working file

Reporting Sources

In calendar year 2006, a total of 633 sexual violence incidents; 148 cases were reported in DCIS reportable incidents; 399 cases were derived from Code of Penal Discipline (COPD) charges and/or convictions; and 498 cases were extracted from the Inspector General's Office (IGO) database, with overlapped reported in 352 cases. The table 14 details the single and multiple sources of reporting.

In calendar year 2007, a total of 842 sexual violence incidents; 162 cases were reported in DCIS reportable incidents; 454 cases were derived from Code of Penal Discipline (COPD) charges and/or convictions; and 807 cases were extracted from the Inspector General's Office (IGO) database, with overlapped reported in 513 cases. The table 15 details the single and multiple sources of reporting.

Findings

In calendar year 2007 55 sexual violence incidents were categorized as rape: 26 reported through the Inspector General's Office only and 21 reported through reportable incidents and the Inspector General's Office. Five COPD rape convictions (I09) are reported during the timeframe, although 15 sexual violence rape incidents were substantiated; 20 unsubstantiated, 20 unfounded.

Definitions issued by the Bureau of Justice Statistics were used for these categories.

Prosecution

In calendar year 2006 three COPD Rape (I09) charges filed, resulting in two convictions of Rape (I09), one case was modified, and the end result was a Sexual Harassment (II24.5) conviction. In calendar year 2007 six COPD Rape (I09) charges filed, resulting in five convictions of Rape (I09), one case was modified, and the end result was a Sexual Harassment (II24.5) conviction. The Executive Director issued Executive Directive “01-05” on February 14, 2005, effective date of March 1, 2005 the COPD offense “Sexual Misconduct (II24)” changed to “Sexual Abuse (II24)” which was finally changed to Sexual Harassment (II24.5) with an effective date of 02/15/2006. The tables 16 and 17 listed a single most serious conviction reported per incident per calendar year, some incidents result in multiple convictions.

Staff Involvement

Calendar year 2007 is the first year that the reporting source for staff involved sexual incidents is available, a total of 49 staff sexual incidents; 16 cases were derived from Code of Penal Discipline (COPD) charges and/or convictions; and 46 cases were extracted from the Inspector General's Office (IGO) database, with overlapped reported in 20 cases. The table 20 details the single and multiple sources of reporting.

Escape and Absent Without Leave

Introduction

This section is intended to provide information about offenders who escape or are absent without leave from facilities, community contract centers, and intensive supervision program (ISP).

Report Procedures

Escape is defined as the act whereby an offender, without proper authority, leaves the confines of the facility or fails to return to official custody following temporary leave granted for a specific purpose and for a specified period of time. Additional definitions include:

Facility Escape – Will be reported as an escape if he or she departs from the operationally defined perimeter of a facility apart from escape incident results in a court conviction or a Code of Penal Discipline (COPD) conviction for escape or if an offender escapes from a work crew or escorted trip outside a facility apart from escape action results in a COPD conviction or court conviction for escape.

Community Escape – If an offender receives a COPD conviction or court conviction for escape or attempted escape, regardless of the amount of time on escape from community contract center or ISP placement, the offender will be reported as an escape; or if an offender is absent from the community contract center without authorization for 24 or more hours the offender will be reported as an escape regardless of whether or not there is a court or COPD escape conviction.

Facility Attempted Escape – An offender will be reported as an attempted escape if the offender is in the process of escape and is apprehended within the operationally defined perimeter of a facility regardless of a court or COPD conviction for escape.

Absent Without Leave (AWOL) – A temporary movement status to which an offender may be assigned prior to discovery of the offender's presence or custody status; or if an offender is absent from the community contract center or ISP placement without authorization for less than 24 hours. The incident will be reported as AWOL if a COPD conviction of unauthorized absence; or failure to remain or return is the final disposition.

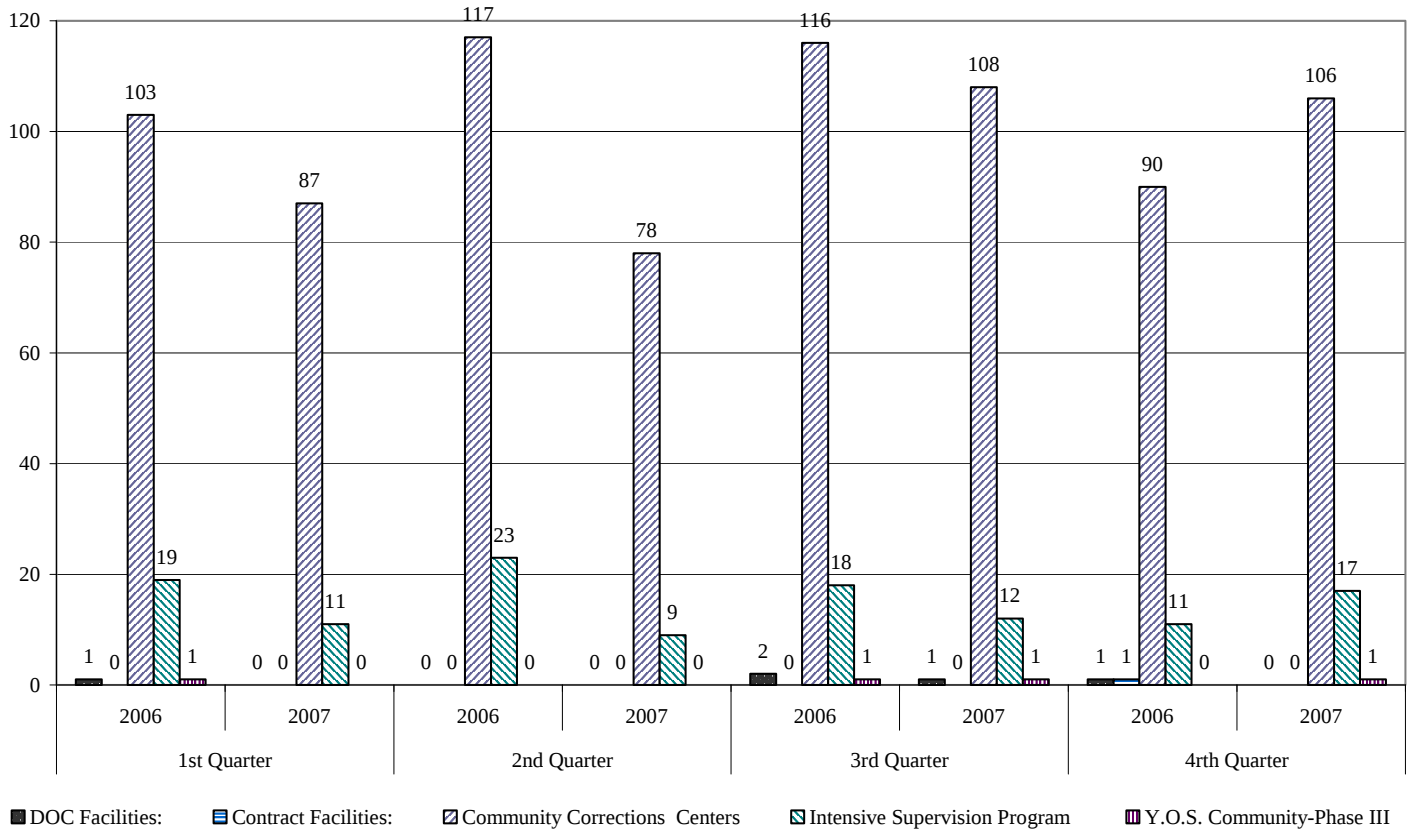
The sources for compiling offender escape data include DCIS, incident reports, movement records, detail escape reports, COPD convictions, and court convictions. Reports of possible escape incidents are reported through the DCIS incident system. Movement records are also monitored and reviewed for possible escape incidents, along with COPD charges and convictions for Escape with Force (I05) and Escape without Force (I06).

Unauthorized Release – Release of an offender without prior CDOC authorization, by another law enforcement agency who has temporary custody. These releases generally occur while the offender is in a county jail for court activities.

Analysis

In 2006, a total of 502 adults and 2 YOS inmates were reported as escape, in 2007 a total of 429 adults and 2 YOS inmates were reported as escape. Table 23 show the total escapes for each quarter by facility, for calendar years 2006 and 2007.

Attempted escapes and absent without leave (AWOL) are shown in table 24 and 25. In 2006 a total of 7 offenders were reported as attempted escape and 337 offenders were reported as AWOL. In 2007, a total of 4 offenders were reported as attempted escape and 356 offenders were reported as AWOL. AWOL offenders who are absent for less than 24 hours and do not receive a COPD conviction for unauthorized absence, failure to remain or return, escape, or a felony conviction are not included in this report. AWOL offenders who are absent greater than 24 hours, regardless of a conviction of unauthorized absence or failure to remain or return, are reported as escape. Table 25 shows the 337 offenders in 2006 and 356 offenders in 2007 that do not meet the escape reporting definition, but received a COPD conviction for unauthorized absence, or failure to remain or return.

Three offenders in 2006 and one offender in 2007 had an unauthorized release without prior CDOC authorization, by another law enforcement agency that had temporary custody. These releases occurred while the offenders were in a county jail for court activities. These releases are not counted as escapes.

Annual Comparisons

A breakdown by year is found in Tables 26 through 30. Table 26 shows a 14.5% decrease in escapes between 2006 and 2007.

Comparisons for calendar years 2006 through 2007 including facilities, contract facilities, community centers, ISP, can be found in Tables 27 and 28. Community escapes decreased 6.6% in 2006 to 428 followed by an 11.0% decrease in 2007 to 381. ISP escapes increased 9.2% in 2006 and decreased 31.0% in 2007.

and Escapes by Placement

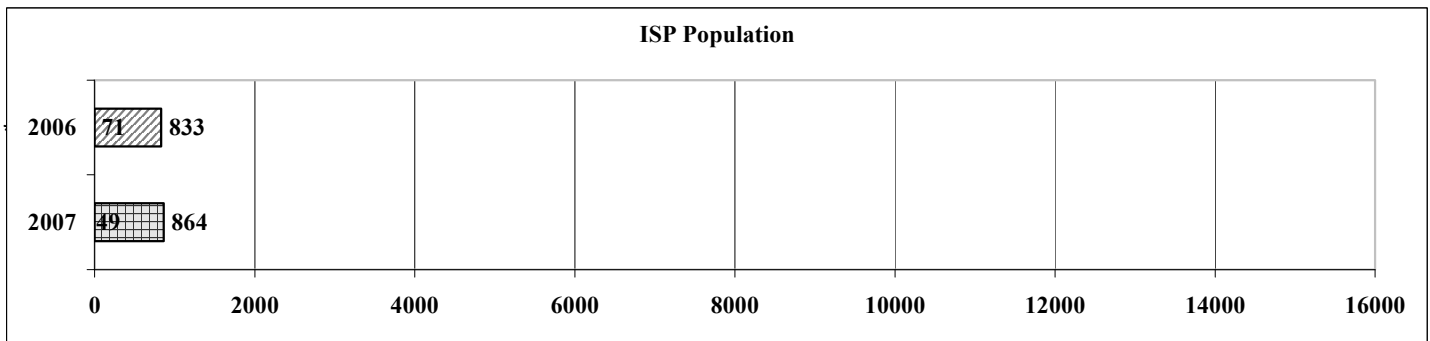
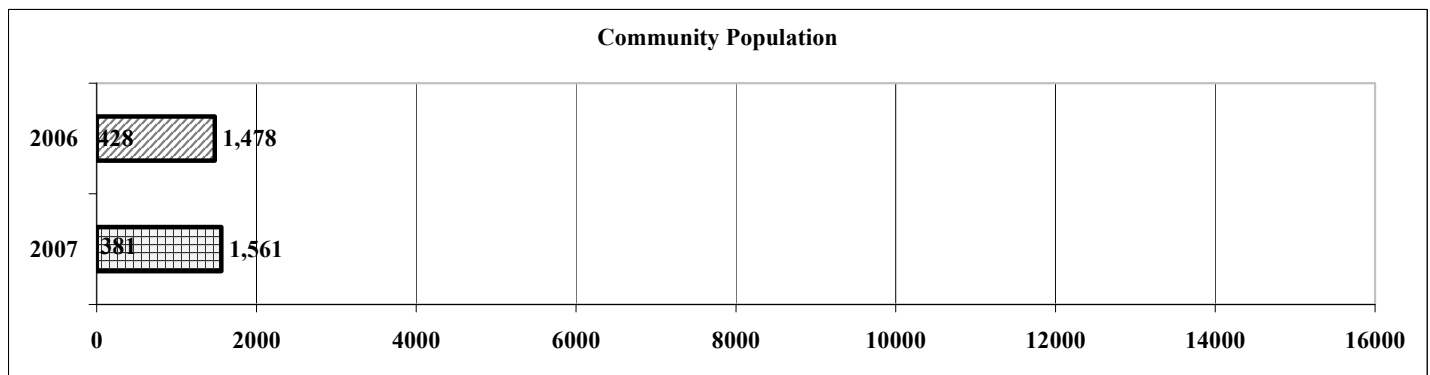
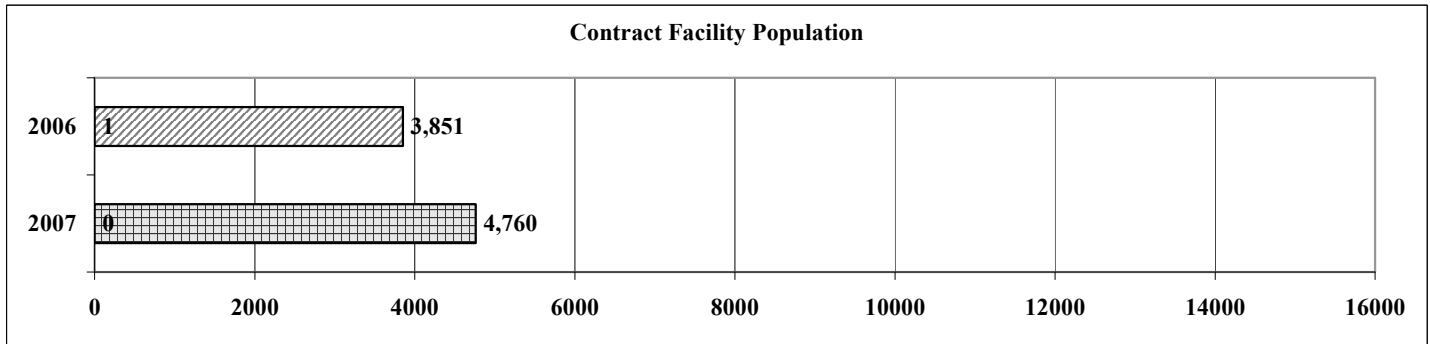
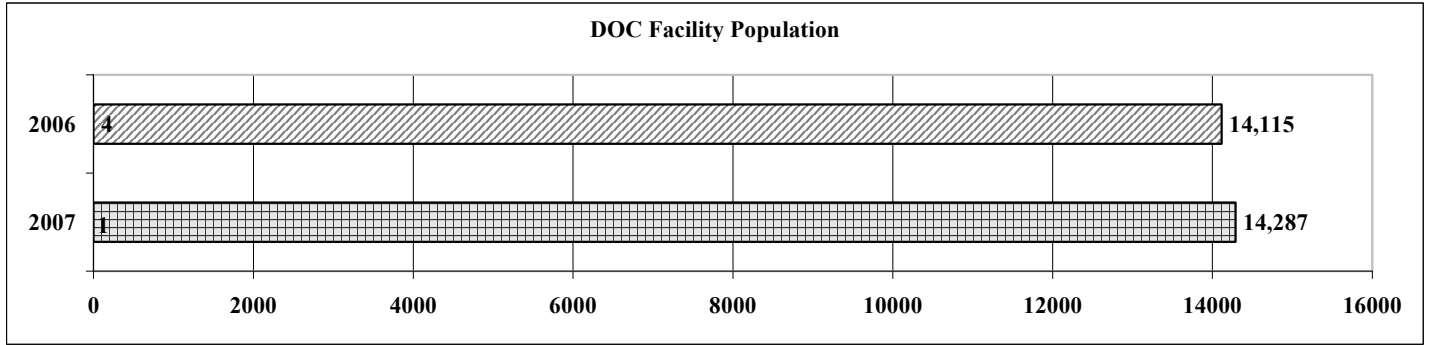

Escapes by Placement

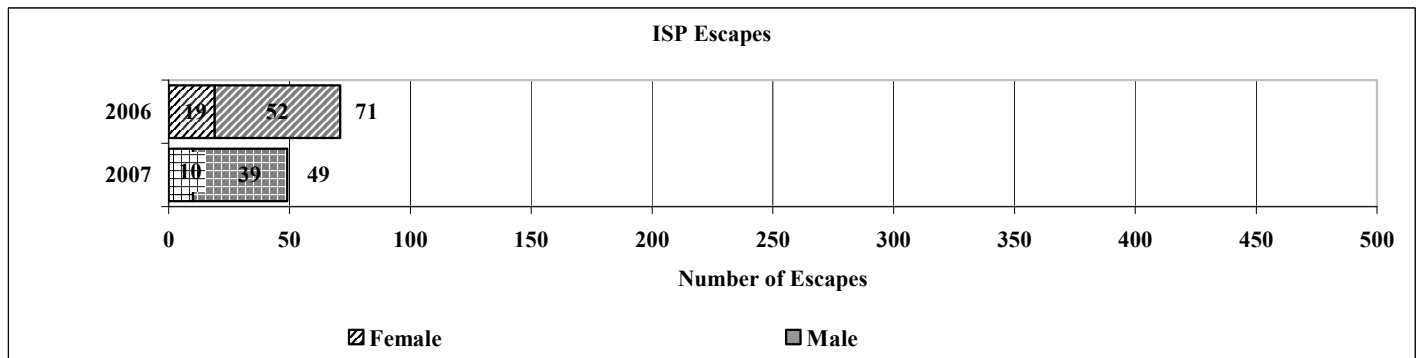
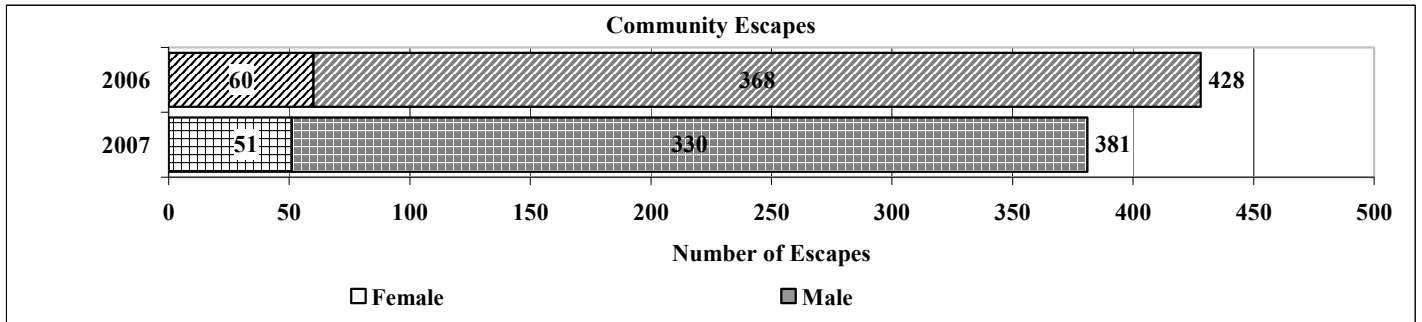
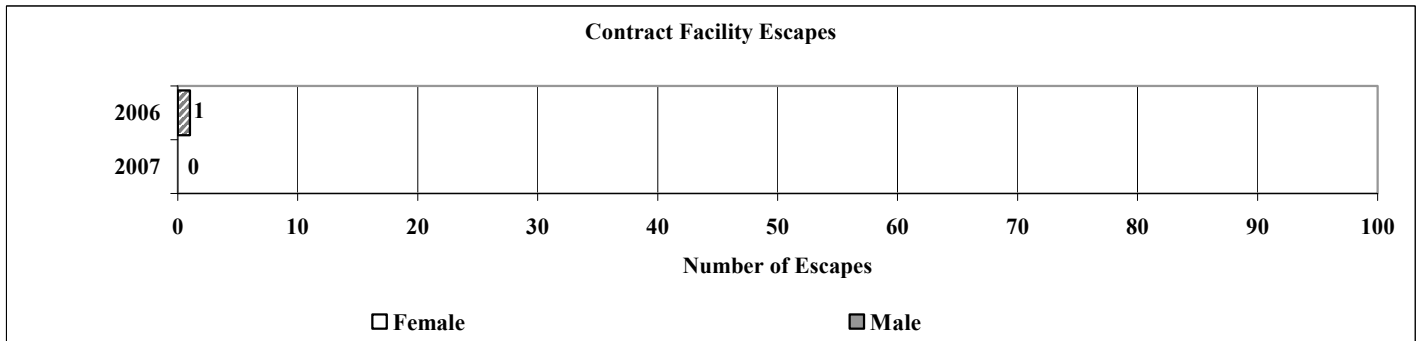
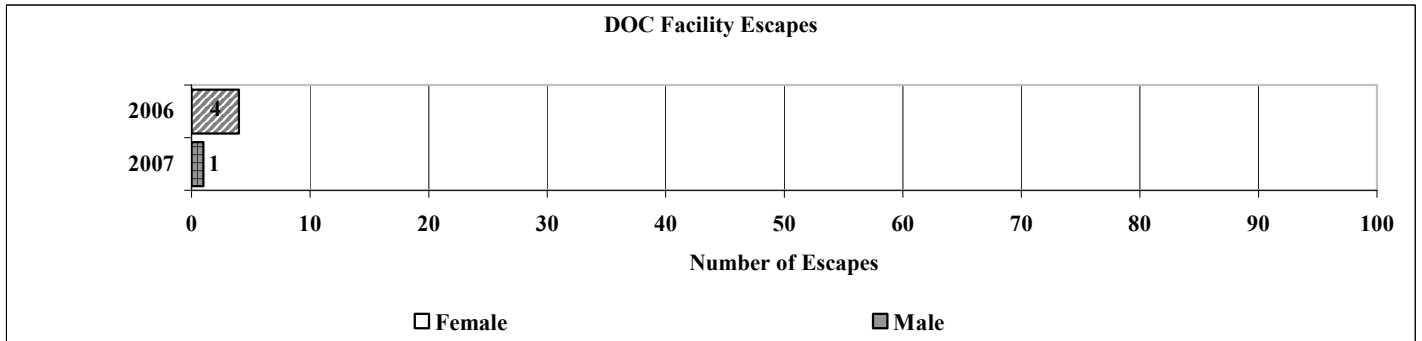

Average Time on Escape Status

Table 31 reflects the number of escapees that have returned to CDOC, and the length of time they were on fugitive status. In 2006, the average length of time on fugitive status was 49.3 days for the 429 captured inmates. 75 inmates remained at large at the end of the reporting period, March 31, 2007 (1 from facilities, 66 from community centers and 8 from ISP). In 2007, the average length of time on fugitive status was 48.5 days for the 372 captured inmates. 59 inmates remained at large at the end of the reporting period, March 31, 2007 (0 from facilities, 54 from community centers and 5 from ISP).

Most Serious Felony Conviction

The most serious felony conviction for the escapee population prior to escape is shown in Table 32; of the 504 escapees in 2006, 88.7% of them are non-violent offenders of the 431 escapees in 2007, 87.0% of them are non-violent offenders.

Disposition of escape and new felony convictions are in Table 33 through 36, Table 33 and 35 shows calendar years 2006 and 2007 new escape felony conviction. In 2006, of the 504 escapees, 246 received a new escape felony conviction, as of March 31, 2007, 172 may have pending felony convictions, and 75 are still fugitives. In 2007, of the 431 escapees, 181 received a new escape felony conviction, as of March 31, 2008, 149 may have pending felony convictions, and 58 are still fugitives. Table 34 and 36 shows the most serious conviction of inmates' new felony conviction while on escape (excluding escape) that he/she committed while on escape status for calendar year 2006 as of March 31, 2007 and for calendar year 2007, as of March 31, 2008.
